





They said it couldn't be done, they said Alabama State had lost only one game, and this was their last. The Tuskegee Golden Tigers still went in to bring us victory.




Tuskegee won the toss and elected to receive. Quarterback Willie Williams then threw 37 yards to left end Freddy Holland on a third down pass play, but two plays later Hornets halfback, Parks Mitchell, intercepted a Willie Williams pass and the 'Bama boys took over on their own 27 yard line. The Hornets were ineffective in three plays and punted out to the 38. From here the Golden Tigers went over for first blood with McGehee carrying the ball. The PAT attempt was no good 'Skegee led 6-0. The Hornets attempting to pass were set back 17 yards in three plays by the charging Golden Tigers line and had to punt. In the second quarter Tuskegee punted from deep in their territory to midfield and the Hornets started goalward. The State eleven got Tuskegee with their backs to the wall in 13 running plays. Hawkins from the two yard line went over for a score to even things up, 6-6.

On the next play which was in the next quarter, White passing to the left flat, threw short and right into the waiting arms of George Drake who went untouched for 45 yards to score. The score was 12-6. An intercepted pass four plays after the Golden Tigers kicked to State, proved fatal to the Hornets again. Floyd Jones ran 52 yards to score on a pass from Willie Williams. The conversion was no good, and the score was 18-12. Later Williams found Marshell open and hit the rangy half-back with a perfect strike for the final score. The score was now 24-12. The Hornets in the last quarter with less than a minute to play scored and made the conversion and the final score was 24-20.





DR. HORACE GREELEY DWIGGINS

Dr. Dwiggins died September 30, 1958, at their home in Tuskegee Institute. Dr. Dwiggins was born March 17, 1909, in Kansas City, Kansas, the second child of Horace G. and Willa Dwiggins.

He grew up in Kansas City and was graduated from Sumner High School there in 1926.

He was graduated from Lincoln University in Pennsylvania in 1930. While a student there he became a member of Alpha Phi Alpha Fraternity. In 1934 he was graduated from Meharry Medical College and shortly thereafter became a Diplomate of the National Board of Medical Ex-

Dr. Dwiggins served as interne at the Kansas City General Hospital No. 2 from 1934-35, as resident surgeon at Wheatley

"WE BELIEVE IN THE LIFE OF SERVICE" -"We shall prosper in proportion as we learn to glorify and dignify labor and to put brains and skill into the common occupations of life."

These lines, taken from The Tuskegee Creed and the quotation from the Founder's famous Atlanta Exposition Address, tell in a most expressive manner the guiding principle upon which the late Mr. Royal B. Dunham based his life. His contributions to Tuskegee Institute and the community are represented not only in brick and mortar but in a dedication to skill and craftsmanship which he passed on to those with whom he worked.

He was twice graduated from Tuskegee Institute, having received both a high school diploma and a Bachelor of Science degree.

Following his graduation from college in 1936, Mr. Dunham taught for four years at Staley High School in Americus, Georgia. He returned

Provident Hospital, Kansas City, from 1935-37 and received staff appointment in general surgery at the Veteran's Administration Hospital, Tuskegee, Alabama, in 1938. His graduate work in Ophthalmology began in 1941 at the Veteran's Administration Graduate School, Bronx,

From 1947-48 Dr. Dwiggins was a resident in Ophthalmology at Provident Hospital, Chicago, Ill. During the same period he was a fellow in Ophthalmology at the University of Illinois. Dr. Dwiggins served as Lieutenant Colonel in the U. S. Army Medical Corps from 1942-46

At the time of his passing Dr. Dwiggins was the Chief Ophthalmologist at the Veteran's Administration Hospital, Tuskegee, heading the department of accredited Resident Training Program. Dr. Dwiggins also served as consultant at the John A. Andrew Memorial Hospital, the Alabama State Department of Rehabilitation and the Alabama Sight Conservation Association. The Alabama Sight Conservation Association. vation work is sponsored by the Lions Club of the State. Dr. Dwiggins was also a member of the American Medical Association, the National Medical Association, the Alabama State Medical Association, a Diplomate of the National Board of Medical Examiners, Diplomate of the American Board of Ophthalmology, Fellow of the American Academy of Ophthalmology and Otolaryngology, and a Fellow of the American College of Surgeons. Dr. Dwiggins was a 33rd Degree Mason, a member of Alpha Phi Alpha Fraternity, and a member of


Dr. Dwiggins was a former member of the Tuskegee Institute Faculty, and was on the Staff at the John A. Andrew Memorial Hospital where he served as consultant to the Student Health Clinic.

to Tuskegee in 1940 to head the Brickmasonry Division. In 1943 he was assigned to the task of building the facilities at Moton Field, Primary Air Training Center. He remained as instructor in Maintenance and Construction until 1946.


Upon returning to Tuskegee Institute's Masonry Division he was appointed Superintendent of Construction and has served in that capacity with great distinction. Some of the construction completed under his direction are: The Arts and Crafts Unit at the Children's House, the Roberts Circle Faculty Housing Unit, The School of Veterinary Medicine, The Residence Hall, The Carver Foundation Laboratory Building, Benjamin Russell Nursery School and the four new dormitories now under construction.

Among the major renovation jobs Mr. Dunham directed are: Dorothy Hall, including the downstairs Food's Service unit and the first and second stories of the residence section; the four Emery Buildings and Rockefeller Hall.

Mr. Dunham was a member of the Westminster Presbyterian Church, Gamma Sigma Chapter of the Phi Beta Sigma Fraternity and was active in many civic business enterprises among which was the Federal Savings and Loan Association.



Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. is one of the most outstanding spiritual and moral leaders of the world. FORMER INSTITUTE CHAPEL




International in scope, chapters of the Fraternity exist in Geneva, Switzerland, and Monrovia, Liberia.
