TO THE MEMORY OF

T. W. JONES

Timothy W. Jones, associate professor of electrical engineering and former Dean of the School of Mechanical Industries, died Sunday morning at John A. Andrew Memorial Hospital. He was 58 years old.

The funeral service was held at Greenwood Missionary Baptist Church, Wednesday, at 11 a.m. Members of the faculty of the Tuskegee School of Engineering were honorary pallbearers.

Born in Sacramento, California, Mr. Jones moved to Macon, Georgia at an early age after the death of his parents. He attended Balard Normal School in Macon and Tuskegee Institute High School, graduating in the class of 1920. He received the Bachelor of Science and Master of Science Degrees in Electrical Engineering from Iowa State College, Ames, Iowa.

Before joining the faculty of the School of Mechanical Engineering at Prairie View State College, Prairie View, Texas, and before coming to Tuskegee Institute in 1941, he was a successful electrical contractor in Chicago.

Mr. Jones was a deacon of the Greenwood Missionary Baptist Church where he also served as church clerk. He was chairman of the Tuskegee Institute Chapter of the Red Cross, a member of Alpha Phi Alpha Fraternity and several other professional organizations.

He is survived by Miss Susie A. Epps, Macon, Georgia; Mrs. Arlena West Turner, Tuskegee Institute; Mrs. Alpha W. Baker, Greensboro, N. C.; Mrs. Julia Pettit, Bronx, N. Y.; and Mrs. Ophelia G. Hill, Birmingham, Alabama.

Home life for Embryo is rather quiet. He shares a room with Mr. Alcorn in the Old Cooper Home and shows a remarkable preference for Ken L. Ration over cafeteria food.

His social life includes varied activities. He has an unusual interest in education and visits the academic building regularly. It's not unusual to see him standing with the male students on the cafeteria steps during the noon day meal. However, this is no indication of their influence, for he is basically an individualist. He is not affiliated with any organization but has a tendency to show Omega influence.

For sporting he enjoys an occasional race after a motor scooter or a horse and wagon. Most of all he enjoys riding in cars but prefers to be chauffeured; therefore, he takes a back seat. His sometimes aggressive attitude will lead to a fight and only recently caused him to be hospitalized. Nevertheless he attends church every Sunday with his master at the Greenwood Missionary Baptist Church.

Embryo is not much of a ladies' man and therefore returns home at the end of the day. His status among the other campus dogs is one of the very highest and in all I guess you might call Embryo the Dog with a capital "D".

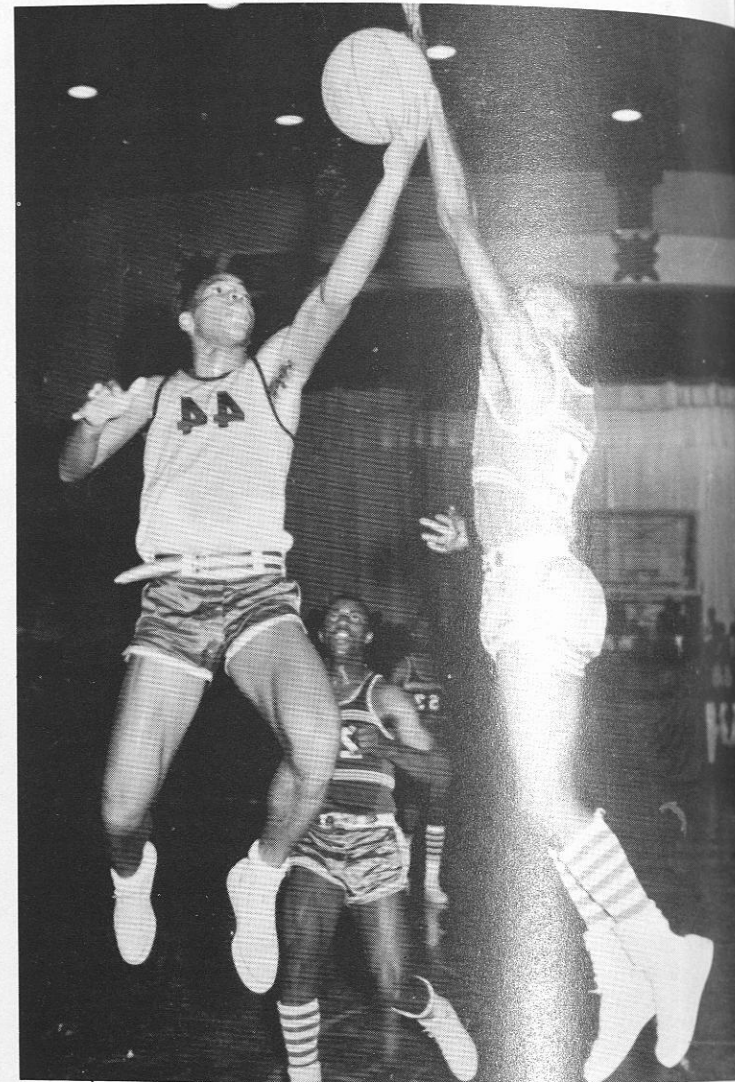
Deadlock Fort Valley
