The doing of each job well.



## TO THE MEMORY OF . . .

T. W. JONES

Timothy W. Jones, associate professor of electrical engineering and former Dean of the School of Mechanical Industries, died Sunday morning at John A. Andrew Memorial Hospital. He was 58 years old.

The funeral service was held at Greenwood Missionary Baptist Church, Wednesday, at 11 a.m. Members of the faculty of the Tuskegee School of Engineering were honorary pallbearers.

Born in Sacramento, California, Mr. Jones moved to Macon, Georgia at an early age after the death of his parents. He attended Balard Normal School in Macon and Tuskegee Institute High School, graduating in the class of 1920. He received the Bachelor of Science and Master of Science Degrees in Electrical Engineering from Iowa State College, Ames, Iowa.

Before joining the faculty of the School of Mechanical Engineering at Prairie View State College, Prairie View, Texas, and before coming to Tuskegee Institute in 1941, he was a successful electrical contractor in Chicago.

Mr. Jones was a deacon of the Greenwood Missionary Baptist Church where he also served as church clerk. He was chairman of the Tuskegee Institute Chapter of the Red Cross, a member of Alpha Phi Alpha Fraternity and several other professional organizations.

He is survived by Miss Susie A. Epps, Macon, Georgia; Mrs. Arnena West Turner, Tuskegee Institute; Mrs. Alphia W. Baker, Greensboro, N. C.; Mrs. Julia Pettit, Bronx, N. Y.; and Mrs. Ophelia G. Hill, Birmingham, Alabama.

Solomon Frazier and James Mc-Junkins backed up McCullom as both bewildered their opponnents with 12 points each. Junior Edward Brackins accounted for 10 of the team's 20 points. Leading the scoring for A&M was J. Mims with 18 points.

#### Lose To Fisk

Highly rated Fisk University, paced by Renaldo Glover, clobbered the Tigers in Nashville, 100-75. The Bulldogs completely outclassed the Tigers as they barked their way through the entire game. 
### Deadlock Fort Valley


