

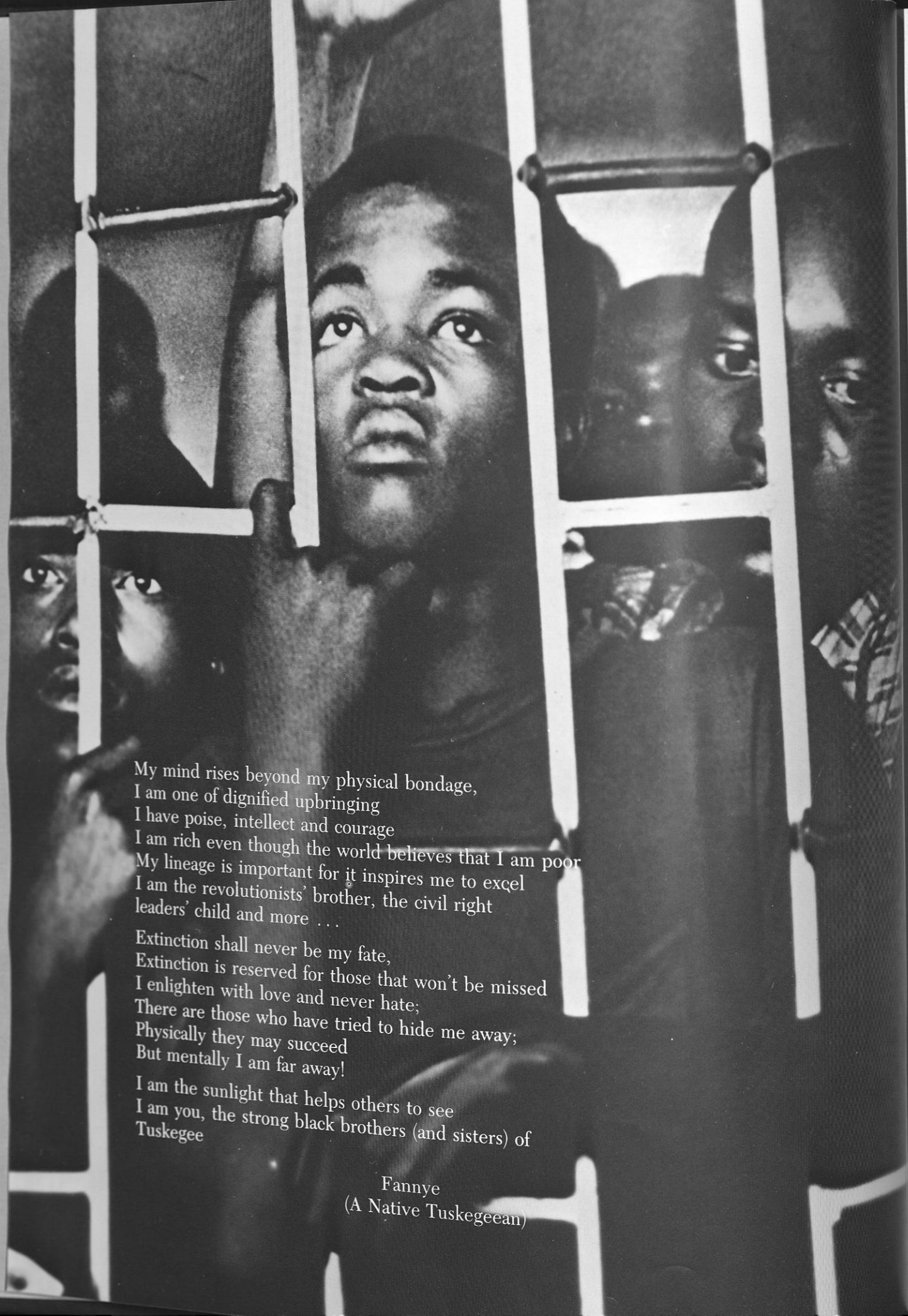

## THE INSTITUTE

Tuskegee Institute was established on February 12, 1881 by an act of the General Assembly of Alabama. On July 4, 1881 Booker T. Washington opened the school and became its founder and first principal. Tuskegee Institute is privately controlled, co-educational, fully accredited, professional and technical institute. It follows a semester calendar with fall, winter/spring and summer semesters. Tuskegee Institute offers 45 degree granting courses in a variety of areas of instruction. The undergraduate degrees offered are in the schools of Art and Sciences, Education, Applied Sciences, Engineering, Social Services, Natural Sciences, Nursing and Veterinary Medicine. Graduate degrees include the Masters of Science, Masters of Education and Doctor of Veterinary Medicine.



Tuskegee Institute has an adequate staff consisting of approximately 800 members, one-third of which are employed as teacher faculty. Many faculty members author books, publish articles and hold civic posts or offices in national professional societies. Other faculty members are involved in the Institute's counselling program. Extracurricular activities, but also educational experiences, include the choir, student government association, the school newspaper (Campus Digest) staff, drama, dance, and the marching band (Crimson Pipers) and/or concert band, and the school annual (the Tuskeana). There are four national Greek letter fraternities for men and four for women. Other student organizations and activities include: departmental professional clubs; Associated Women Students Organization; United Men's Congress; various military organizations under the ROTC program academic honor societies and the Young Men's and Young Women's Christian Association, College Union Board and the African Heritage Association for Tuskegee Institute. Varsity basketball, football, soccer, tennis, track, volleyball, golf and rifle teams created in as well as intramural team for these sports. Tuskegee Institute's campus itself is a historical as well as modern site. Among other buildings on its 1,500 acres are the Carver Research Foundation, Carver Museum, Hollis Burke Frissell Library and the Tuskegee Institute Chapel.

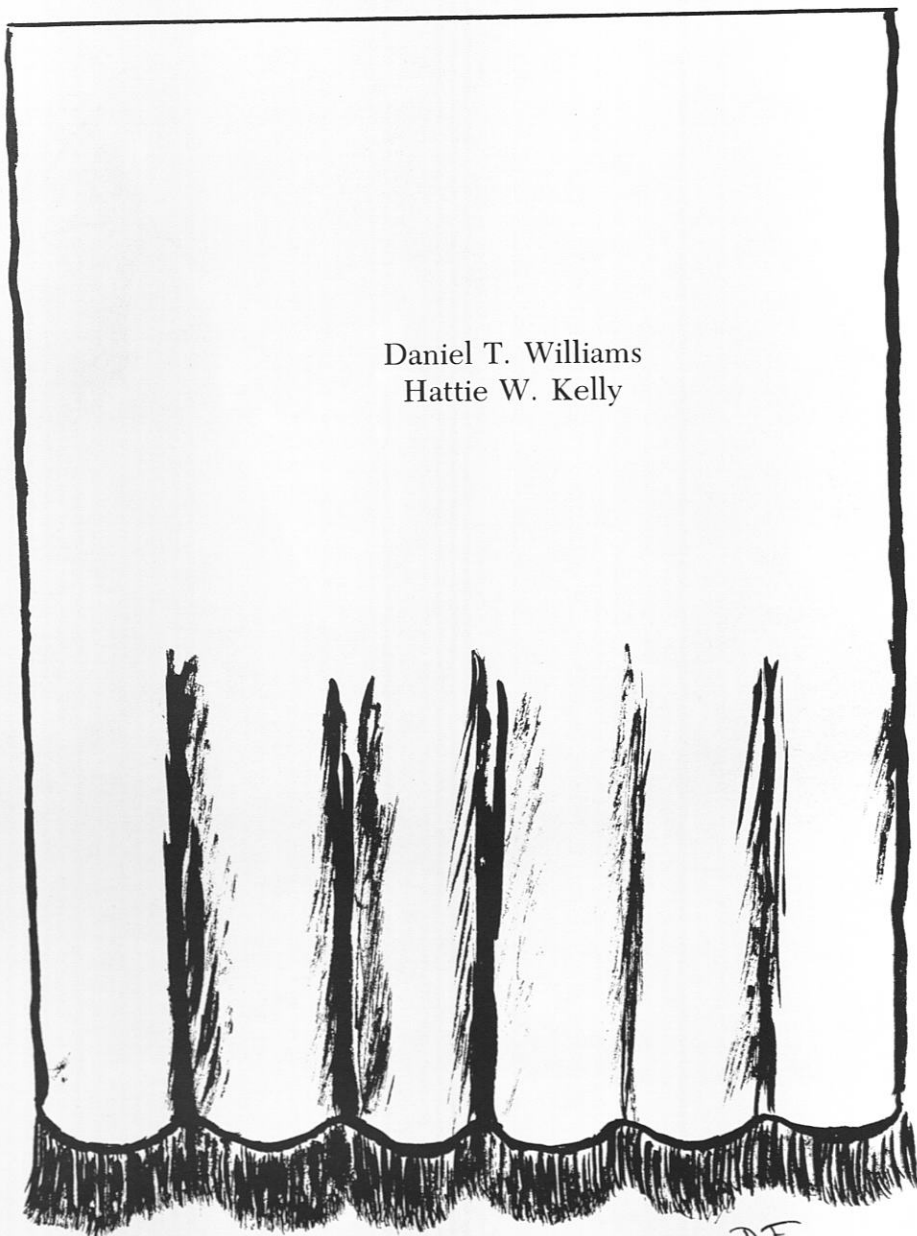

The Tuskegee Job Corps Center is a coeducational center with an enrollment capacity of 248 Corpsmembers. This program provides individualized self-paced programs encompassing basic and advanced reading and math, health and world of work, drivers education, G.E.D. and college preparatory classes. Julian Bond has been the embodiment of the New Politics since 1965. He sees the New Politics as an outgrowth of the civil rights movement of the 1960's. As one of the founders of the Student Non-Violent Coordinating Committee, he participated in the voting drives, sit-ins and other activities of that movement, until his campaign for State Representative in 1965. Since then, Bond has spearheaded a number of grass-roots campaigns to foster full participation in the political process by minorities. In 1965, there were fewer than 100 Black elected officials in the South; today there are over 2,000, and the number continues to grow, thanks partially to the efforts of Bond and the organizations he sponsors and supports. Bond is presently serving in the Georgia State Senate.

Julian Bond was there at the beginning of the New Politics, and he still stands today as the ideal of the American dream: a Man who will stand and fight within the political system for the rights of the neglected.
