


Dire transitions take me from line to line, forcing me to wait until the world gets its act together.

Sometimes I'm king, but kingdoms are rare, and I humbly bow before Math and English because I know my place and where I stand in line.


I change each day on my way toward becoming.

I change with — and prepare for — nothing will hold me back, for I am a Tuskegeean.






































# TUSKEGEE OLDEST, BUT FINEST

The Band Cottage is one of the oldest historical buildings on Tuskegee Institute's campus. Constructed in 1889, it was originally called the "Foundry and Forge Shop," used to instruct students in blacksmithing and metallurgy. Currently it is used as a rehearsal area for the Marching and Concert Bands. This unique cottage is recognized by the students and faculty of Tuskegee Institute as a primary symbol of motivation and campus spirit.






"The Oaks," built in 1899, was the home of Tuskegee Institute's founder, Booker T. Washington. It included many modern conveniences such as electricity and plumming, which were a novelty for many blacks in the south during that era. It is located on main campus, and is presently a National Historic Site where guided tours are conducted by the National Parks Service. "The Oaks" signifies beauty, strength, tradition, and character, which are all a part of Tuskegee Institute's exceptional history and foundation.




Jobs Corps was created in 1965 as one of the first major government efforts directed at the problem of hard core, unemployable youth — youngsters for America's bleak enclaves of poverty who, until that point, had generally been ignored by the larger society.

The Tuskegee Job Corps Center opened on April 15, 1983, to meet the above challenges. Since its inception, 206 Corpsmembers have graduated, 84 Corpsmembers have stepped-off at a completion level in their vocations, 111 Corpsmembers have recieved drivers licenses and 77 Corpsmembers have passed the GED test.

The Tuskegee Job Corps Center is a co-educational Center with an enrollment capacity of 248 Corpsmembers. Enrollees are recruited from the "Black Belt" areas of Alabama and other southeastern states. The Tuskegee Job Corps Center is the only Job Corps Center in Alabama and is the only one in the United States operated by a college or University.

#### JAMES BALDWIN (b. 1924)


James Baldwin is an American essayist, novelist, and playwright whose birth and rearing in Harlem made a dynamic impact on his later years. He became a preacher at age 14 but abandoned the church at the age 17. He received his education in New York City schools and graduated from De Witt Clinton High School in 1942.

Editor of his high school's literary magazine, by 1946 Baldwin had published a book review in *The Nation*. Since that time he has written several publications and received many distinguished awards and fellowships. His work has been translated into Danish, French, German, Italian, Japanese, Swedish, and other foreign languages.

and feelings of the black community and other minorities. His fiction works include the books Go Tell It on the Mountain (1953), Giovanni's Room (1956), Another Country (1962), Going to Meet the Man (1965), Tell Me How Long the Train's Been Gone (1968), and (more recent books) If Beale Street Could Talk and Just Above My Head. Proof of his skills as an essayist are found in four noted volumes: Notes of a Native Son, Nobody Knows My Name, The Fire Next Time, and The Devil Finds Work. His plays include The Amen Corner and Blues for Mr. Charlie.

In 1943, Baldwin lived in New York's Greenwich Village, where he worked various odd jobs and continued his writing after high school.

Only half a decade later, disillusioned by by racism in the United States, he went to Paris and lived there for several years. He returned to America, however, to become an ardent critic of racism and discrimination, but returned to Europe to divide his days between southern France and Istanbul.
