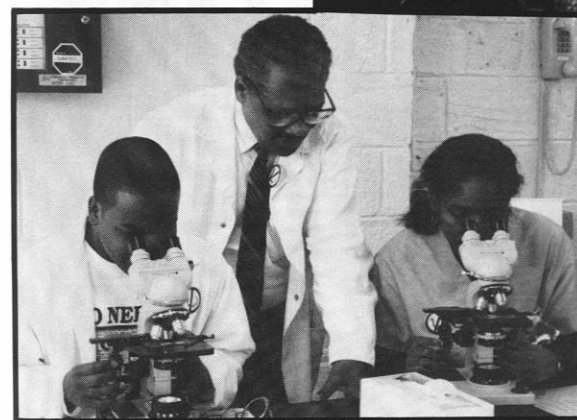

HOMECOMING '92

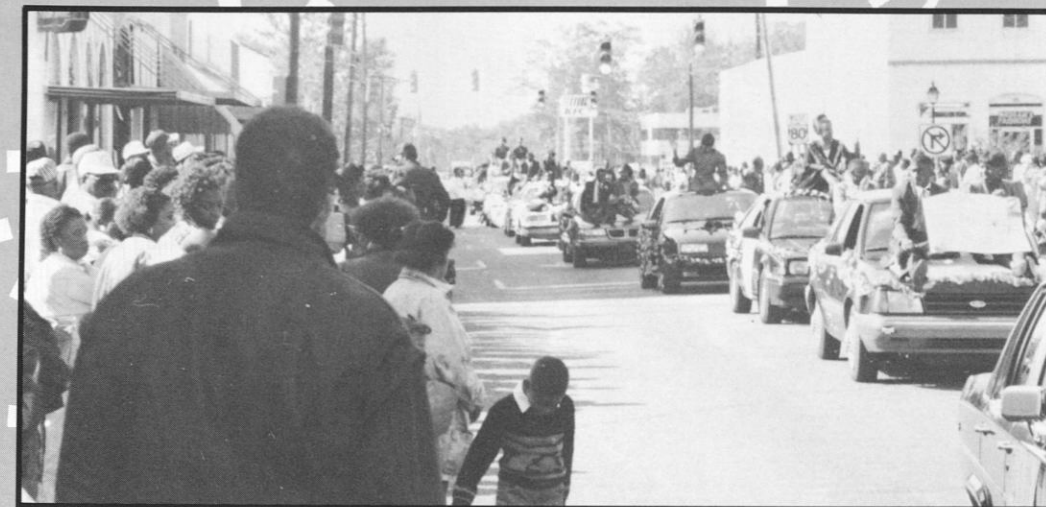
