## Auskegee University

### Surviving the Test of Time

Tuskegee University, founded in 1881 by Booker T. Washington, is a co-educational, independent, and state related professional, scientific, and technical institution located in the southeastern part of Alabama. Tuskegee University has grown from a modest beginning - with 20 students and a one room shanty- to a modern campus of 4,500 acres of land and more than 150 buildings and structures, valued at \$266.2 million. The University enrolls more than 3,700 students annually from 42 states, of whom 48 percent are male and 53 percent are female. Among that number are 233 foreign students, representing 30 countries. The University has an annual operating budget of approximately \$65 million.

Undergraduate instruction is organized through seven major divisions: the College of Arts and Sciences and the schools of Agriculture and Home Economics, Business, Education, Engineering and Architecture, Nursing and Allied Health, and Veterinary Medicine. These divisions offer the bachelor's degree in more than 45 majors, 25 master's degree programs and additional programs leading to the Doctor of Veterinary Medicine.

The university provides a wide range of extracurricular activities, including fraternities and sororities, special interest groups, and a variety of intramural sports. The university's teams compete in the Southern Intercollegiate Athletic Conference. There are varsity teams for men in baseball, basketball, cross-country track, football, tennis, and track and field. Women's varsity teams compete in basketball, tennis, track and field, cross-country track and volleyball. The University competes in Division II of the NCAA



## THE 1995 TUSKEANA PAUSES TO REMEMBER THOSE LOST TIGERS

## DR. LUTHER H. FOSTER, JR. President Emeritus Tuskegee University March 21, 1913 - November 27, 1994



Dr. Foster came to Tuskegee in 1941 serving as Business Manager for 12 years and as President for 28 years. He retired in 1981.

Dr. Foster received Bachelor degrees from Virginia State and Hampton Universities, an MBA with distinction from Howard University; M.A. and Ph.D. degrees from the University of Chicago. He was the recipient of several honorary degrees, as well as Distinguished Alumnus awards from Hampton, Harvard and Chicago Universities. He was elected to the Alabama Academy of Honor.

In Tuskegee, Dr. Foster was an active member of St. Andrew's Church. In Alexandria he was a member or the Search Committee for a New Rector at Church of the Resurrection.

He served on numerous boards and committee, including Sears Roebuck, Norton Simon, Teachers Insurance and Annunity Association, March of Dimes, and the American Association of Colleges.

More recently, Dr. Foster served as Board Chairman, Academy for Educational Development; board member of Joint Committee for Political and Economic Studies; United Negro College Fund; and Institute for Church Administration Management.

Among memberships were Resources for the Future, President's Advisory Commission on International Education and Cultural Exchange; College Retirement Equities Fund; American Revolution Bicentennial Commission; U. S. Air Force Advisory Council; Race Relations Information Center; Overseas Development Council; and the Center for Creative Leadership.

He was a member of Alpha Phi Alpha Fraternity, Sigma Pi Phi Boule, Phi Delta Kappa, Society for Values in Higher Education, and Tuskegee Airmen

### GWENDOLYN P. SIPP Miss Tuskegee University 1986



Ms. Sipp was the first campus queen to serve as "Miss Tuskegee University" and subsequently served on the University's board of Trustees.

Ms. Sipp, a cost accounting supervisor with Kraft General Foods Incorporated, in Allentown, Pennsylvania, was a 1986 graduate of Tuskegee University. Prior to her appointment at Kraft, she was a manager trainee and a accounting supervisor with Cargill, Incorporated, Minneapolis, Minnesota.

She was an honor student here at Tuskegee, active with the Student Government Association, Delta sigma Theta Sorority, Incorporated, the United Negro College Fund, the March of Dimes, and the Marching Crimson "Piperettes" Dance Corps.

Prior to her matriculation here at Tuskegee, Delta Sigma Theta Sorority honored her as Outstanding High School senior. Other honors included: "Citizen of the Week" in high school, "Miss Black Daytona Beach" and "Miss State Of Alabama Desert Shrine Queen"

Ms. Sipp was 30 years old.

DR. JOHN E. PRICE Instructor, Composer

Mr. Price was a member of the Tuskegee University faculty since 1981 and the author of 593 musical compositions for stage and films. Mr. Price was commissioned to compose a work for the 1996 Olympics in Atlanta, and his "Five Folk Songs" was performed in Berlin at the International College Music Society.

Mr. Price was a native of Tulsa Oklahoma and held degree from Lincoln University in Missouri and the University of Tulsa. Before comming to Tuskegee, he taught at Florida memorial College and Eastern Illinois University and was staff pianist, composer and vocal coach at the Kamaru Theatre in Cleveland.

Here at Tuskegee he was the University's organist, and several of his collections of nearly 600 compositions won awards from the American Society of Composers, Arthurs and Publishers.

The <u>National Pan-Hellenic Council (NPHC)</u> is currently composed of eight National Greek letter Fraternities and Sororities: Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority, Alpha Phi Alpha Fraternity, Delta Sigma Theta Sorority, Zeta Phi Beta Sorority, Kappa Alpha Psi Fraternity, Sigma Gamma Rho Sorority, Phi Beta Sigma Fraternity and Omega Psi Phi Fraternity.

"Unanimity of thought and action" was the main stated purpose of the NPHC that was organized in 1930 on the campus of Howard University in Washington, DC. Today, the NPHC is headquartered in Indiana and the function of the organization is to promote interaction, encourage cooperation and provide support for each member fraternity and sorority. Through national and regional conferences, meetings and an NPHC newsletter, members exchange information and address issues of mutual concern.

The bond that unites each organization is its dedication to addressing the societal ills of racism and poverty that are the root cause of many other issues that plague the African American community. As each member organization has grown in scope, the NPHC has also evolved as well. Its continued legacy of promoting unity and social action has moved the African American community forward and has forever changed American society as a whole.

Here at Tuskegee University we have the following group of the NPHC organizations currently on our campus: Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority, Delta Sigma Theta Sorority, Zeta Phi Beta Sorority, Kappa Alpha Psi Fraternity, Sigma Gamma Rho Sorority, Phi Beta Sigma Fraternity and Omega Psi Phi Fraternity.

ALPHA KAPPA ALPHA Sorority was founded in 1908 at Howard University. The founders, Ethel Hedgeman Lyle and 15 other young ladies, envisioned an organization which would promote social and economic betterment on the local, state, national and international levels.

Moving forward from this beginning, Alpha Kappa Alpha began to impact on college trained women to build through its members a power base throughout the United States, West Africa, the Caribbean, Germany and anywhere that Alpha Kappa Alpha women live or work. The official publication is the *Ivy Leaf*.

As the demands of society become more diverse and pressing, Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority has evolved with the times. She has founded and developed programs and initiatives that parallel her initial objectives and current purposes. The Sorority actively cultivates and encourages high scholastic and ethical standards, promotes unity and friendship among college women, alleviates problems concerning girls and women, and maintains a progressive interest in college life. Through these activities, Alpha Kappa Alpha women fulfill the commitment embodied in her theme of "Service To All Mankind"

At the inception of <u>Delta Sigma Theta Sorority</u>, founded by twenty-two young women in 1913 at Howard University, the founders envisioned an organization of college women who believe in serious and strong community endeavor. Through its programs and activities Delta has demonstrated its vital concern for the social welfare, academic excellence and cultural enrichment of its members while de-emphasizing the social side of sorority life. Their ideals of scholarship and service have withstood the test of time.

Today, Delta Sigma Theta Sorority is a private nonprofit organization whose purpose is to provide services and programs to promote human welfare. The sorority stresses the importance of scholarship and character, dedication to a program of sharing membership skills and organizational services in the public interest.

Delta Sigma Theta's chapters are located throughout the United States, the Virgin Islands, the Caribbean, Germany and West Africa. The Official publication of the sorority is the *Delta*.

Delta's major program activity takes place at the chapter level where local chapters use their membership, training and resources to meet community needs.

Early in the century, black students were actively dissuaded from attending college. Formidable obstacles were erected to prevent the few who enrolled from assimilating into curricular campus life. This social ostracism characterized Indiana University on January 5, 1911 and cause Byron K. Armstrong and Elder W. Diggs, joined by eight black students to form <a href="Kappa Alpha Psi">Kappa Alpha Psi</a>
<a href="Fraternity">Fraternity</a> which remains the only Greek letter organization with its Alpha chapter on the University's campus.

The founders sought a formula that would immediately raise the sights of black collegians and stimulate them to accomplish higher than they might have imagined. Fashioning achievement as its purpose, Kappa Alpha Psi began uniting college men of culture. Patriotism and honor in a bond on fraternity. Chapters spread in succession to the University campuses. By 1919, Kappa Alpha Psi activity had generated serious interest among black college degree holders to form alumni chapters. The Fraternity's chapters are arrayed in hundreds of cities and on a great number of campuses in the United States and Foreign countries.

Kappa Alpha Psi encourages school and college attendance, promotes academic achievement, provide guidance for career selection, develops and communicate public policy statements on issues affecting local and national concerns and advances social actin and self-help projects in the black community.

Omega Psi Phi Fraternity was founded at Howard University, Washington, DC, on November 17, 1911 by Edgar A. Love, Oscar J. Cooper, Frank Coleman and Dr. Ernest E. Just. It was the first men's Greek-letter social organization on a black campus. The fraternity has more than 600 undergraduate and graduate chapters in the United States as well as chapters in Africa, Asia, the Virgin Islands, the Bahamas, and Germany.

Omega Psi Phi's purpose is to bring about a union of college men of similar high ideals and ambitions of its members; occupy a progressive helpful and constructive place in the political life of the of the community and nations; and foster the humanity Freudian and dignity of the individual; and aid downtrodden humanity in its efforts to achieve higher economic and intellectual statue.

In 1949, Omega Psi Phi Fraternity along with all other similar Greek letter organizations, deleted from its constitution and ritual, any references to race, creed or color. In 1949 the fraternity was among the first to establish a national headquarters with a full time executive secretary.

Phi Beta Sigma Fraternity, was founded by Langston Taylor, Leonard F. Morse and Charles I. Brown on the campus of Howard University in Washington, DC on January 9, 1914. This brotherhood has grown to include chapters throughout the United States Europe, Africa, Asia and the Caribbean.

The 1920's were especially productive for Phi Beta Sigma. It was during that decade that the fraternity begun publication of its official organ, The Cresent, established its scholarship fund; charted its Distinguished Service Chapter and launched its first national service initiative in the area of "Bigger and Better Business" all milestones in the fraternity.

Phi Beta Sigma Fraternity was conceived as a service-oriented organization working to address the needs of our respective communities. The resulting commitment, as embodied in the fraternity motto, "Culture for Service and Service for Humanity" has promoted the fraternity's ongoing efforts to meaningfully impact upon the areas of education, business development, social justice and youth development.



Phi Beta Sigma Fraternity's theme as we approach the year 2000 is: "Sigma Focus on Issues that Impact the African American Male to Strenghten America's Communities."

Sigma Gamma Rho Sorority was founded on November 12, 1922 at Butler University in Indianapolis, Indiana. The story began with the dream of seven young women who understood the need for greater service and achievement through higher education. To attain this they formed a Greek-letter organization for teachers and educators.

Responsibility, stability, purpose and self respect set the level of scholastic expectancy for the chapters, members and pledges of the organization. Collective striving for these qualities of character is necessary for consistently good scholarship. An excellent standard in scholarship was and is directly related to the precepts of quality and character.

Sigma Gamma Rho offer young people an identification with the community through activities that are natural and appealing to the community service, leadership training and education of youth are the guiding forces of the sorority's programs and activities.

Zeta Phi Beta Sorority was organized at Howard University on January 16, 1920, as the result of the encouragement given to the five founders by Charles Taylor and Langston Taylor, members or Phi Beta Sigma Fraternity. They felt the campus would profit by the development of such an organizations sisters to the fraternity.

As a result, Arizona Cleaver, Viola Tyler, Myrtle Tyler, Pearl Neal and Fannie Pettie became founders of Zeta Phi Beta Sorority. Thus in 1920 Zeta Phi Beta and Phi Beta Sigma became the first official Greek-letter sister and brother organizations to share a common constitution.

Zeta Phi Beta was the first Greek-letter organization to charter a Chapter in Africa (1948), the first to form an auxiliary group, the Amicae (Friends of Zeta) and, the first to formulate youth auxiliary groups, the Amicettes.

The objectives of finer womanhood, sisterly love, scholarship and service have brought together women from all parts of the nation and numerous countries, women who have similar ideals, tastes and aspirations. Women in Zeta are a dynamic force dedicated to the principle of working together to improve the human condition by encouraging the highest standards of scholarship through scientific, literary, cultural and educational programs, and to promote service projects on college campuses in the local community. 


# SPORTS





Tuskegee's intercollegiate sports program boasts a highly ranked football team along with men's basketball; men's and women's basketball, tennis, crosscountry and track and field; and women's volleyball.



## Olympic Moments 1948

## Alice Coachman (Davis)

Alice Coachman came to Tuskegee Institute from Albany, Georgia in 1939, as a member of the Madison High School Girls Track Team. She entered the high jump in the junior division and won first place with a leap of 5 feet 4 inches. From 1939 to 1946 she won the high jump in high school and college each year at the Tuskegee Institute track and field carnival. During these years she won the 50 meter run twice and the 100 meter dash three times. In 1943, 1944, 1945 and 1946, she was a member of Tuskegee's Championship 400 Meter Relay Team.

In the National A. A. U. Women's Outdoor and Indoor competition Alice Coachman won the high jump each year from 1941 to 1948. She won the 50 meter run six times, the 100 meter dash three times, and was a member of the 400 meter relay championship team three times. In 1946, she tied for first place honors with Stella Walsh of 10 points each. By having the greatest number of first places she was awarded the trophy. In 1947, she tied for first place honors with Dorothy Dodson with 28 points each.

In the Final Olympic Women's Track and Field Tryout held at Providence, Rhode, Island, July 12, 1948, Alice Coachman won first place with jumps of 4 feet 3/4 inches and a member of the Olympic team. In the 1948 Olympics in London, she set a new olympic record of 5 feet 6 1/2 inches. She was the first American woman to win a Gold Medal in Track and Field in Post-War Olympics.

Alice Coachman Davis has received many honors among those are: (1) Helms Athletic Foundation and Sportfolio Athlete of the Year Award, 1974 (2) Outstanding contribution to Tuskegee's Track and Field Program for Women,, (3) She was inducted into Tuskegee's Institute Athletic Hall of Fame in 1974.


















## Football



The Tuskegee University Golden Tigers completed their 1994 football season, the 101 season with a 6-5 overall record, their first winning season since 1991. TU finished 6-2 in the SIAC, good enough for second place. The two lone setbacks in the conference came against SIAC champion Albany State and Alabama A & M. The Golden Tigers trailed Albany State 9-6 at the start of the fourth quarter before losing 29-6 and lead Alabama A & M 14-0 at halftime before falling 39-22.


The Golden Tigers averaged 347.00 yards per game while yielding 307.9 to opponents. The offense's 229.1 yards per game was rated number one in the SIAC. TU yielded 20.7 points per game and generated 22.1 points per game. Sophomore quarterback Page Dennis engineered 30 touchdowns after taking over the starting


job in the fourth quarter of the opening game against Florida A & M. Dennis completed 164 of 303 passes for 2,347 yards and 14 touchdowns. He rushed for 6 additional touchdowns. Sophomore running back Andre' Dawson gained 821 yards and scored 6 touchdowns. Sheridan Broadcasting Network National Scholar Athlete of the Years and first team All SIAC receiver, Dadario McCutheon, caught 61 passes for 853 yards and 4 touchdowns.

All-SIAC performer Chris Thomas ended his career at TU by leading the team in tackles with 97. He along with second team All-SIAC corner back Walter Brooks, participated in the Annual Snow Bowl All-Star Game in Fargo, North Dakota. The defense finished third in the SIAC in both scoring defense and pass defense efficiency.


