Our President



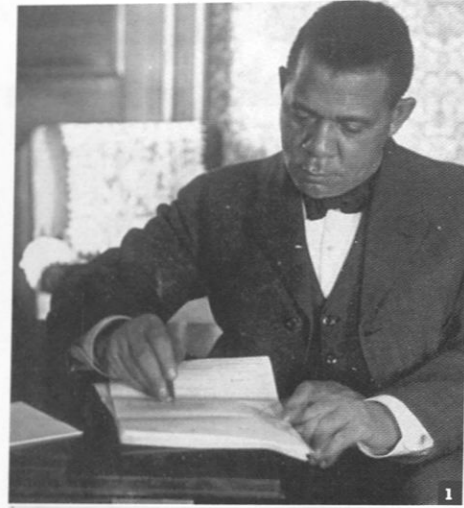
Dr. Benjamin F. Payton, the fifth president of Tuskegee University, has a plethora of accomplishments and accolades, dating back to 1981, when he first took the reins of this historic institution. From leading the change to university status to a near total transformation of campus, the renowned scholar and orator has been revered nationwide. This year was no different.

One of the most noticeable projects was the University capital improvement project, which boasts more than \$45 million in renovations and new construction. Among the projects were renovations to Collis P. Huntington Hall, Ellen C. James Hall, Warren G. Logan Hall and Wilcox A, along with internal improvements made in residential halls. Margaret Murray Washington Hall also received a dramatic transformation, becoming a state-of-the-art student services center.

During the harsh economic times the U.S. has experienced recently, Payton's administration ensured University constituents that the institution would not be affected with the harsh changes most schools were experiences. Tuskegee is one of few schools that had no academic programs cut or any layoffs of faculty and staff.

Payton, who announced in 2009 that he was retiring after 28 illustrious years, also serves as a role model for not only academic and professional excellence, but for family importance. With advance and doctoral degrees and a stellar resume of experience, he is married to First Lady, Thelma P. Payton, who is frequently present by his side at various campus and national events. They share two children and four grandchildren.

Looking back over his institutional accomplishments and their lasting impact, it is clear to see that Payton has inarguably continued a legacy of excellence for Tuskegee University.

1881 Our Timeline of Excellence 2010

1. Booker T Washington
This former slave was the principal and guiding force behind Tuskegee Institute in Alabama, which he founded in 1881. He became recognized as the nation's foremost black educator.

2. The First Class
This is one of the first nursing lectures in Tuskegee Institute. Here you can see the difference in the learning environment in those years compared to now.

3. The Tuskegee Song
In honor of Tuskegee University's 25th Anniversary in 1906, Paul Laurence Dunbar was asked by founder Washington to write a poem capturing the Tuskegee spirit.

4. Tuskegee in The Making
Nothing delighted Washington more than to see students doing the actual work of creating Tuskegee Institute buildings. These students are raising the roof of one of the buildings.

5. The Lincoln Gates
The developing stages of the famous gates to Tuskegee Institute.

6. Tuskegee Institute Movable School
The Alabama Movable School was an outreach effort of Tuskegee Institute (now Tuskegee University) aimed at bringing modern agricultural tools and methods to rural areas and people in Alabama.

7. The Fountain
The university fountain was the centerpiece of the yard in the 1970s. Its unique shape and beauty captivated students and visitors from afar.

8. Tuskegee Airmen
When you think of our great institution, the legendary Tuskegee Airmen come to mind. The all-black squadron of pilots reportedly never lost a plane in pursuit.

9. College of Business and Information Science
The College of Business and Information Science received a new state-of-the-art facility equipped with computer labs, office and class space, and study rooms. The building is named after Board of Trustees member and pioneering economist Dr. Andrew F. Brimmer.

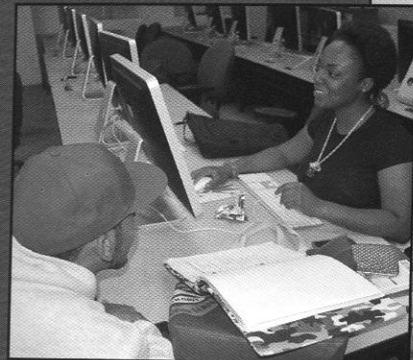
10. Golden Tigers
Our Golden Tiger Football Team was awarded the HBCU National Championship award for its undefeated 2007 season and being the first HBCU to reach a total of 600 wins.

11. James Hall
This building has been renovated and now serves as a coed honors dorm for students who meet high scholastic achievements.

12. Reconstruction
Washington Hall, which contains more than 25,000 square feet, will provide state-of-the-art accommodations for the Office of Admissions and Enrollment Management, gift shop, bookstore, and additional dining services.

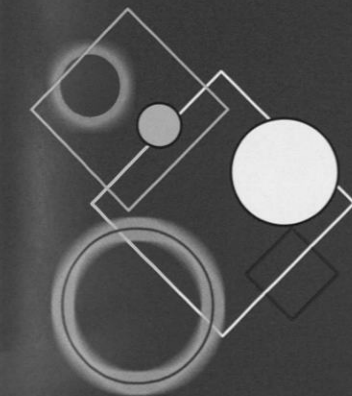
D'Aundria Foster

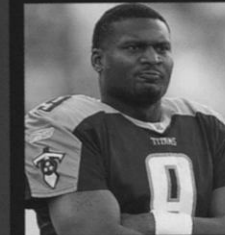

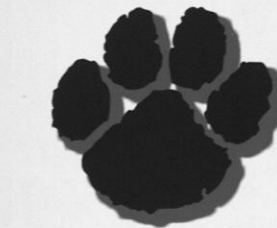
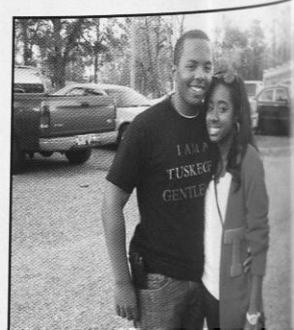
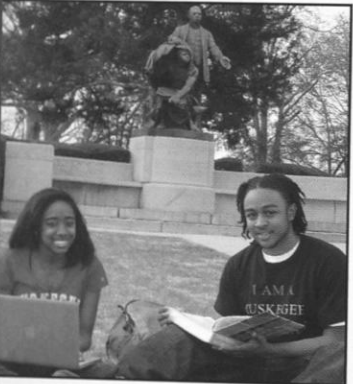




The Freshmen Experience

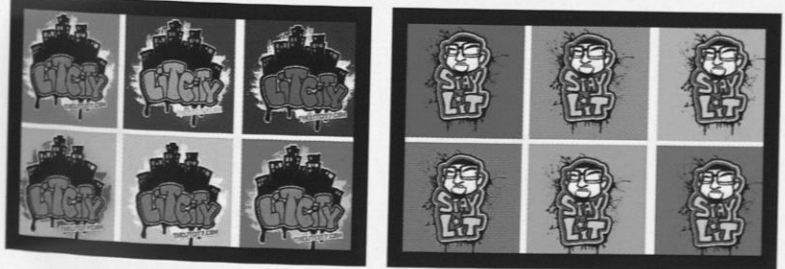


Young Entrepreneuers

On March 3, 1913, the 22 founders of Delta Sigma Theta made themselves known to the world in their first public act with their participation in the Women's Suffrage March in Washington, D.C. Nearly 100 years later, the members of the Gamma Tau Chapter continue that same display of courage and set out to do just the same. During Delta Week 2010, the chapter members organized a march on campus in dedication to the victims of the Haiti. The march started on the yard and ended at the University Chapel for a worship service.

Delta Sigma Theta Sorority Inc. was founded Jan. 13, 1913 in Miner Hall on the campus of Howard University by 22 strong and intelligent black women. 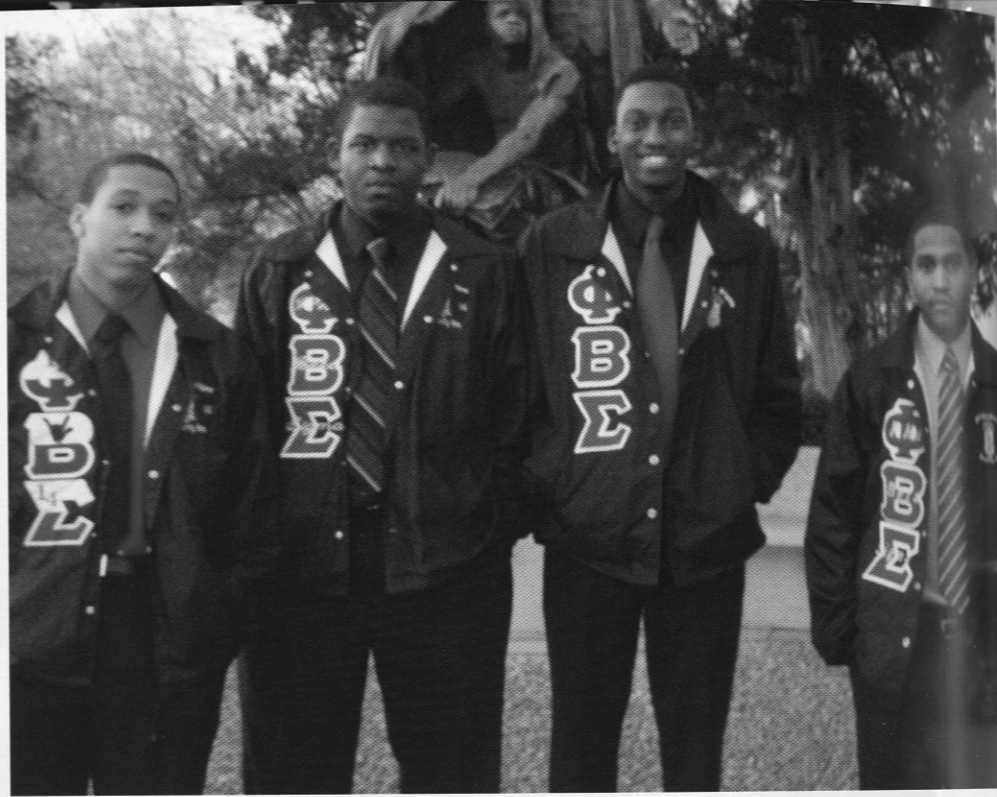
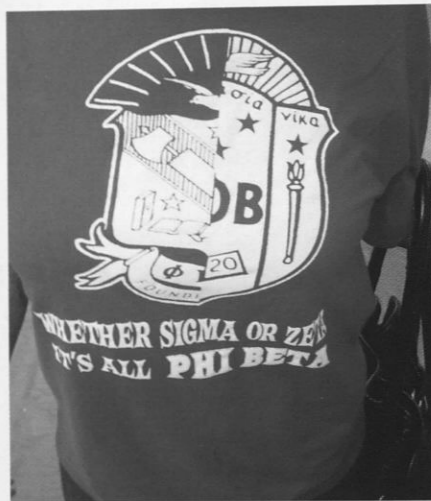

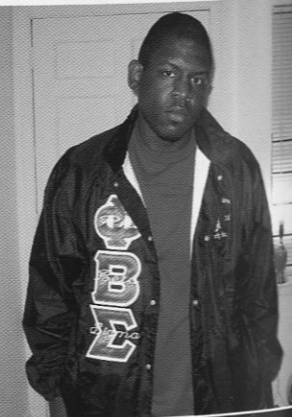

Phi Beta Sigma Fraternity was founded at Howard University in Washington, D.C., on Jan. 9, 1914, by three young African-American male students. The founders, A. Langston Taylor, Leonard F. 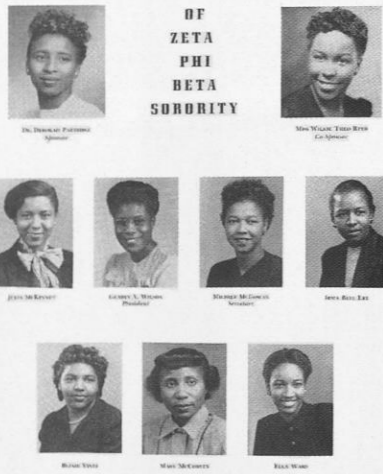

Zeta Phi Beta was founded Jan. 16, 1920 by five coeds at Howard University in Washington, D.C.: Arizona Cleaver, Myrtle Tyler, Viola Tyler, Fannie Pettie and Pearl Neal. These five women, also known as the "Five Pearls," dared to depart from the traditional coalitions for black women and sought to establish a new organization predicated on the precepts of scholarship, service, sisterly love and finer womanhood. It was the ideal of the founders that the sorority would reach college women in all parts of the country who were sorority-minded

and desired to follow the founding principles of the organization. During Zeta Week 2010, "Blue Love Addiction," the ladies hosted such events like the "Any Given Sunday" Super Bowl Party, "Breaking all the Rules Fun Day" on the yard, the all-male "What a Woman Wants" auction, relations forum and "Name that Tune." The Thundering Theta Beta Chapter was chartered April 15, 1948 by seven elegant and independent collegiate women.

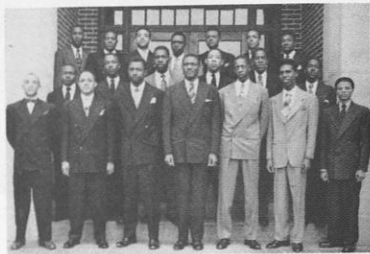

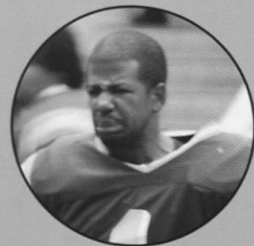

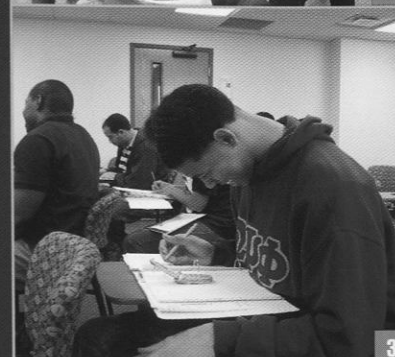

On Nov. 17, 1911, three Howard University undergraduate students, with the assistance of their faculty adviser, biology professor Ernest E. Just, gave birth to the Omega Psi Phi Fraternity. The three liberal arts students were Edgar A. Love, Oscar J. Cooper and Frank Coleman. From the initials of the Greek phrase meaning "friendship is essential to the soul," the name Omega Psi Phi was derived. The phrase was

selected as the motto. Manhood, scholarship, perseverance and uplift were adopted as cardinal principles. A decision was made regarding the design for the pin and emblem, and thus ended the first meeting of the Omega Psi Phi Fraternity. 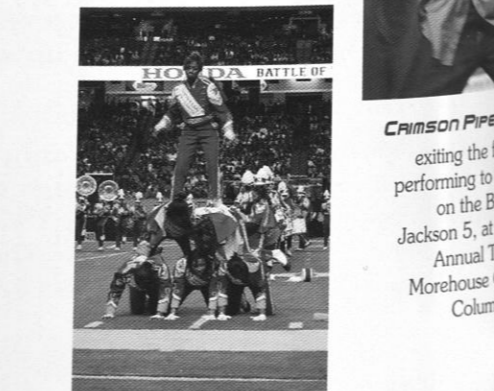
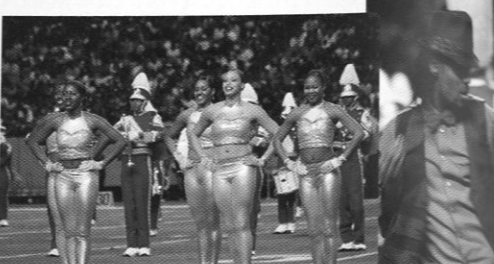

Tuskegee University has recorded its rich history in yearbooks since 1922, beginning with the *Carver*. The annual has been known as the *Tuskeana* since 1939. Previous names include the *Victorian* (1924); *Crimson and Gold* (1927, 1928, 1938); *Annulet* (1935); and the *Loganete* (1936-1937).

Madame President

Dr. Andrew F. Brimmer, Chairman of the Tuskegee University Board of Trustees, announced the appointment of Dr. Charlotte P. Morris as Interim President of the institution, effective August 1, 2010. Her selection was the result of an enthusiastic vote of the entire Board. She will serve in this capacity while the search committee completes its work for a permanent president. By Board policy, the new Interim President will not be a candidate for the permanent position. Morris has served in a number of roles at the University for the past 25 years. For the past 22 years, she has worked with President Benjamin F. Payton as Executive Associate to the President and Secretary to the Board of Trustees. In addition, she serves as Director of the Tuskegee University Title III Program and as Chair of Convocations and Special Events. Morris has also been named Associate Dean and Professor of Management in the College of Business and Information Science. She will assume those duties when she steps down from the position of Interim President. A resident of Montgomery, Ala., since 1983, Morris is a Golden Life member of the Montgomery Alumnae Chapter of Delta Sigma Theta Sorority Inc.; the Agnes J. Lewis Federated Women's Club (where she serves as Vice President), and she is a member of The Lilly Missionary Baptist Church, (where she serves on the Usher Board, the Sunday School Ministry, and the Missionary Circle). Her honors and awards include the I Dure Award for Qualities of Leadership, service awards from the Charles Stewart Mott Foundation, Jackson State University and Tuskegee University. She was designated a Bush Foundation Fellow in 2005.



"I am delighted to be asked to play a significant role in the legacy of this historic institution," Morris said. "I will work as a great team, and I am confident we will keep the institution intact for the new president."

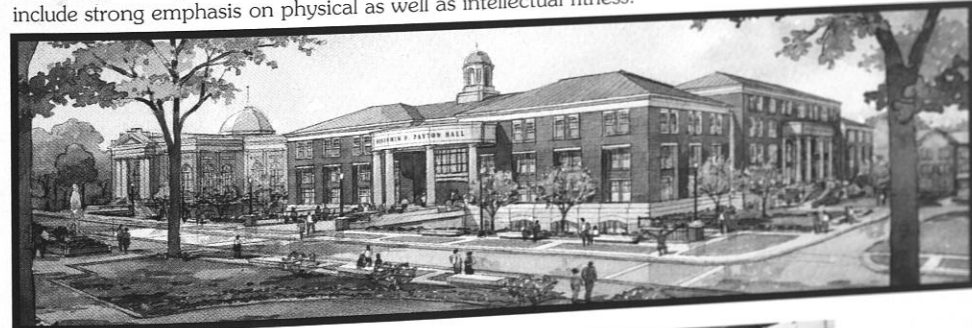
