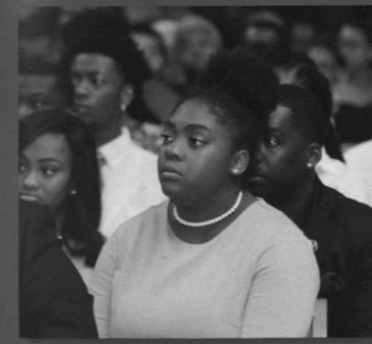

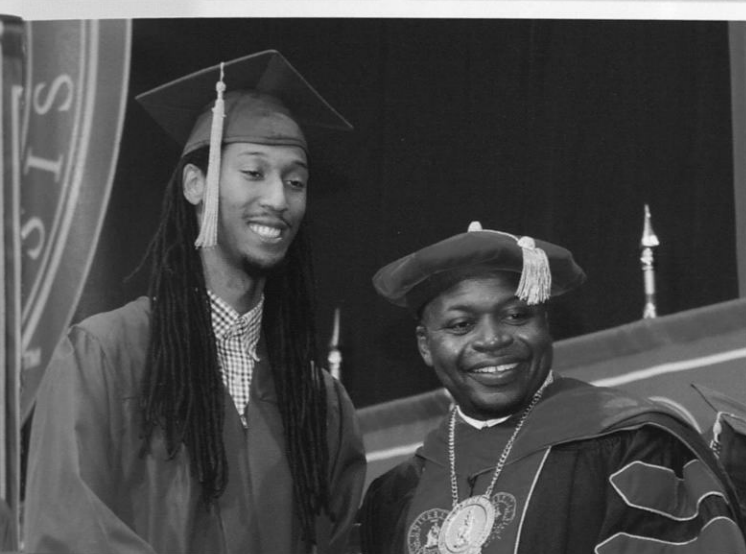
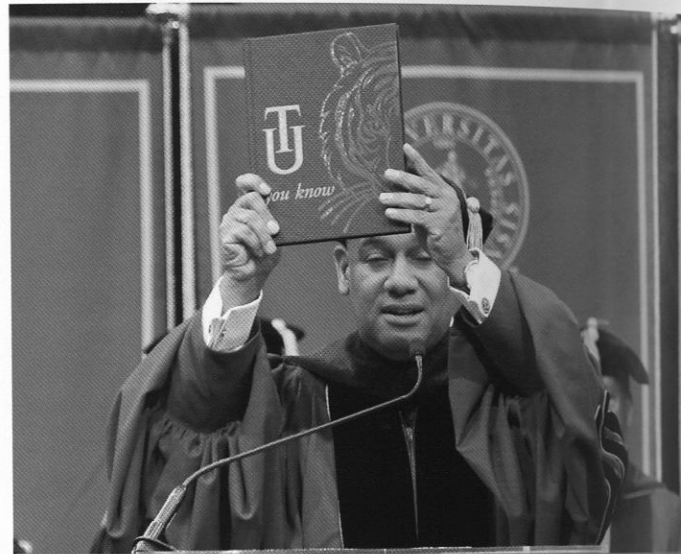
Each year the Annual Spring Commencement falls after the printing date of the present Yearbook. But, we still want to display the amazing graduation highlights from the previous year. Therefore, we hope you enjoy these highlights from the Spring 2017 Commencement!! Tuskegee University's 2017 Spring Commencement was held on Saturday, May 13, 2017 in the General Daniel "Chappie" James Center, and was one to remember. As graduations are all about farewells and new beginnings, this was the first time our TU family welcomed John Skipper, CEO of ESPN as Tuskegee University's Commencement Speaker. And this was the last time that Tuskegee University's 7th President Dr. Brian Johnson, graced the podium as President of the University.

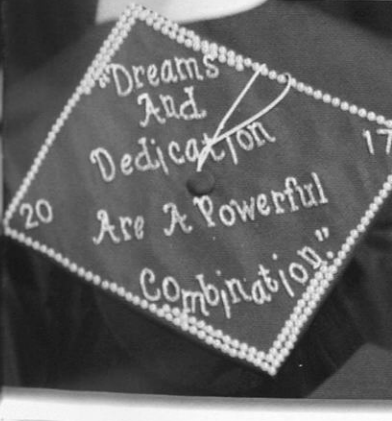
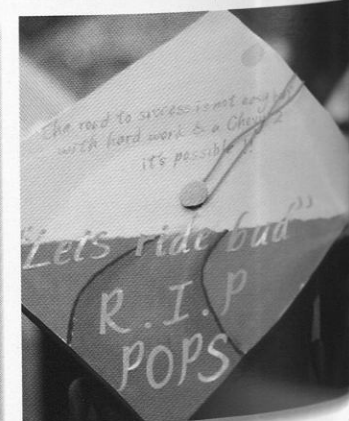
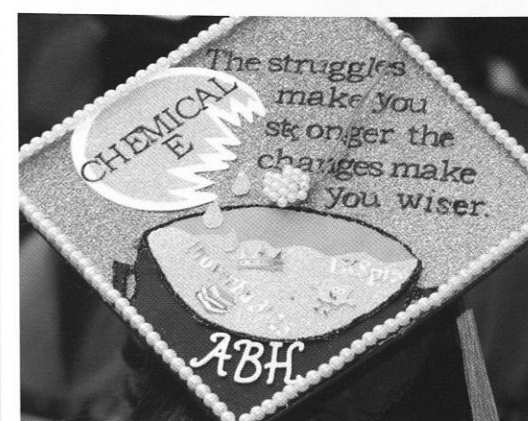
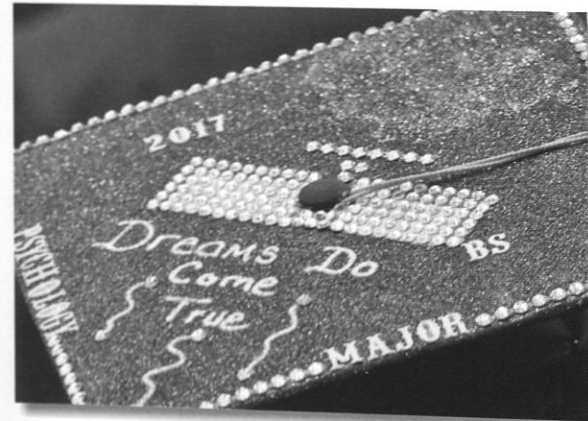
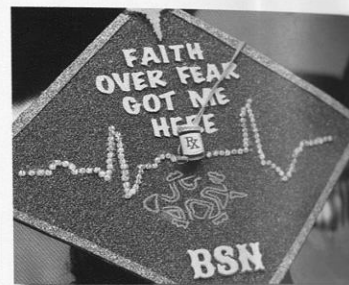
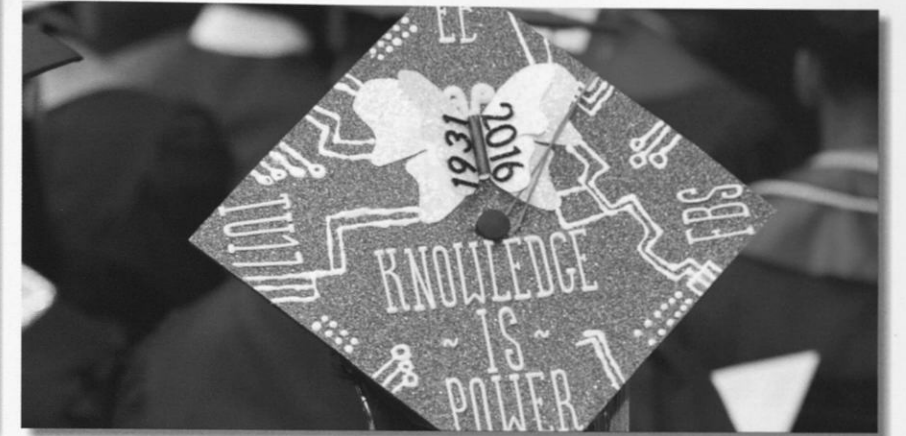
Tuskegee also had to bid a bittersweet farewell to Kevin Lacey, the Golden Tigers Quarterback and 2016 SIAC Defensive Player of the Year. Lacey ended his 3-season career as a Golden Tiger throwing for 2,232 yards and 20 touchdowns. A stand-out moment at the 2017 Spring Commencement was the appearance of the Marching Crimson Piper Band welcoming John Skipper with its rendition of the ESPN Sports Center anthem followed by the infamous Ball and Parlay. The Marching Crimson Piper Band was led by head drum major Brandon Burroughs, who was also graduating along with several other band members. Just as Tuskegee students are always prepared, Burroughs just so happened to have his drum major hat and staff with him at Commencement. The same nostalgic feelings that overcome us all when we hear Ball and Parlay, must have affected Mr. Skipper as well, as he personally requested that the song be played at Commencement, as well as Dr. Johnson, who bounced up and down to the tune.


During the 2017 Spring Commencement, 536 degrees were awarded to 468 graduates. There were 410 bachelor's degrees (including 15 double majors), 54 master's degrees and six doctoral degrees. Alongside of the 2017 Spring Commencement, Tuskegee University's College of Veterinary Medicine held its very first Inaugural Commencement. The ceremony took place Saturday, May 6, 2017 in the Tuskegee University Chapel. Tuskegee welcomed back alumna Dr. Christine Jenkins '84 as the Veterinary Medicine Ceremony speaker. This class was the 68th class to receive a Doctor of Veterinary Medicine from Tuskegee University. Sixty-Six Veterinary Medicine graduates said farewell to Mother Tuskegee as they were hooded and participated in the Veterinarian's Oath on May 6, 2017.

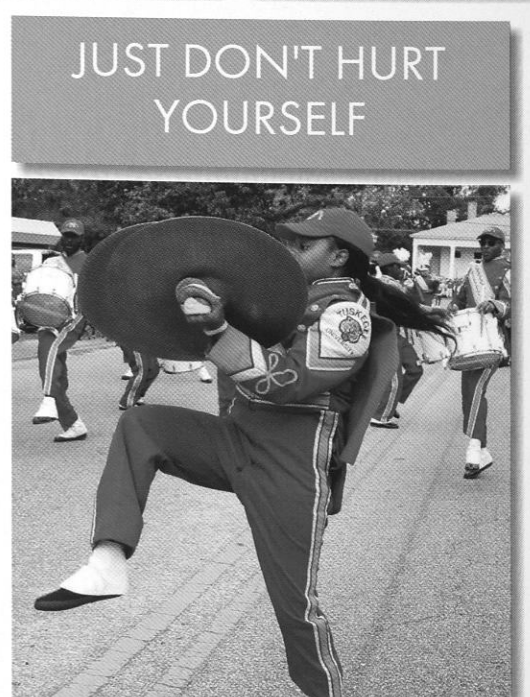
AUGUST 21, 2017 SOLAR ECLIPSE

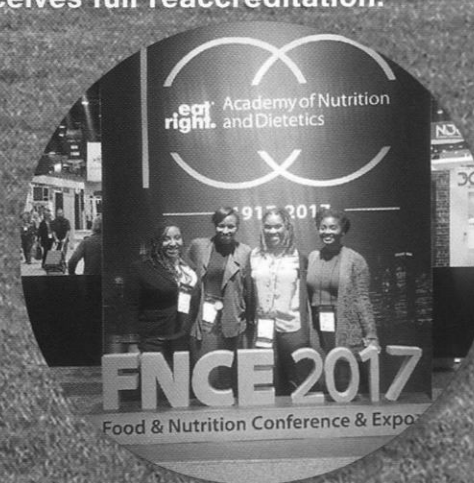

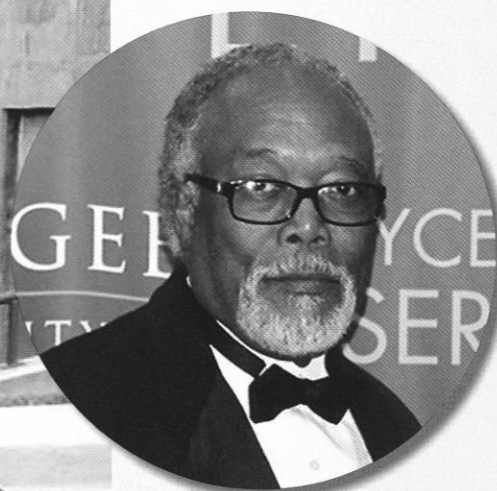

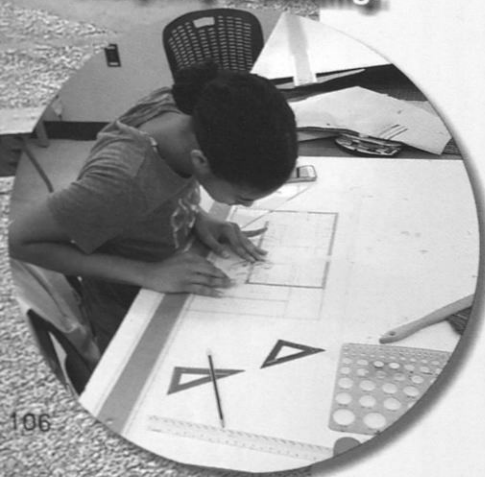
Robert R. Taylor School of Architecture and Construction Science

As the 5th President of Tuskegee University, Dr. Benjamin F. Payton was a tremendous force behind bringing this University into the 21st Century.

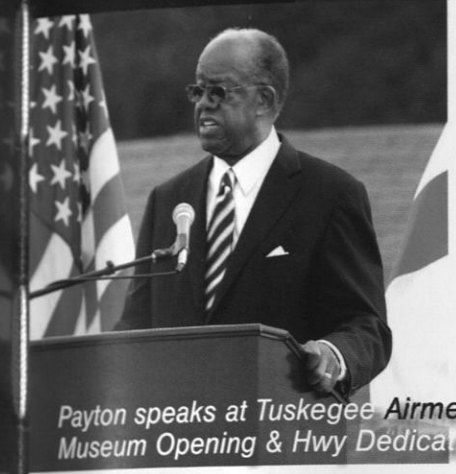
He is credited with the following:

- 1) Succeeded in getting the school's name changed from Tuskegee Institute to Tuskegee University in 1985;
- 2) Established the General Daniel "Chappie" James Center for Aerospace Science Engineering and Health Education;
- 3) Launched TU's first Ph.D. programs (Materials Sci Engr & Integrative Biosciences);
- 4) Developed the TU National Center for Bioethics in Research and Health Care and got title corrected from "Tuskegee Syphilis Study" to "USPHS Syphilis Study";
- 5) Launched the TU C. Alfred "Chief" Anderson Department of Aviation Science;
- 6) Developed the TU Kellogg Hotel & Conf Ctr;
- 7) Restructured the academic programs into five colleges and reorganized all programs;
- 8) Successfully completed a \$150 million Capital Campaign by raising \$169 million and undertook an additional \$60 million campaign, the Legacy Campaign;
- 9) Reconstructed & renovated entire campus, including new parking, roadways, library, several academic bldgs, student residence halls, on-campus student apartments; and enclosed it all with beautiful brick and cast-iron fences and gates, including a dramatic new set of campus entrances and exits;
- 10) Launched the construction of several new academic buildings;

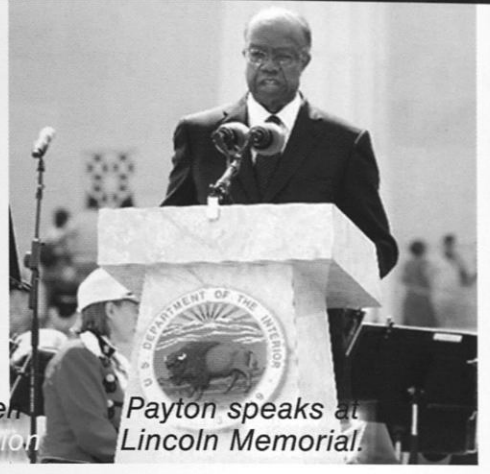
