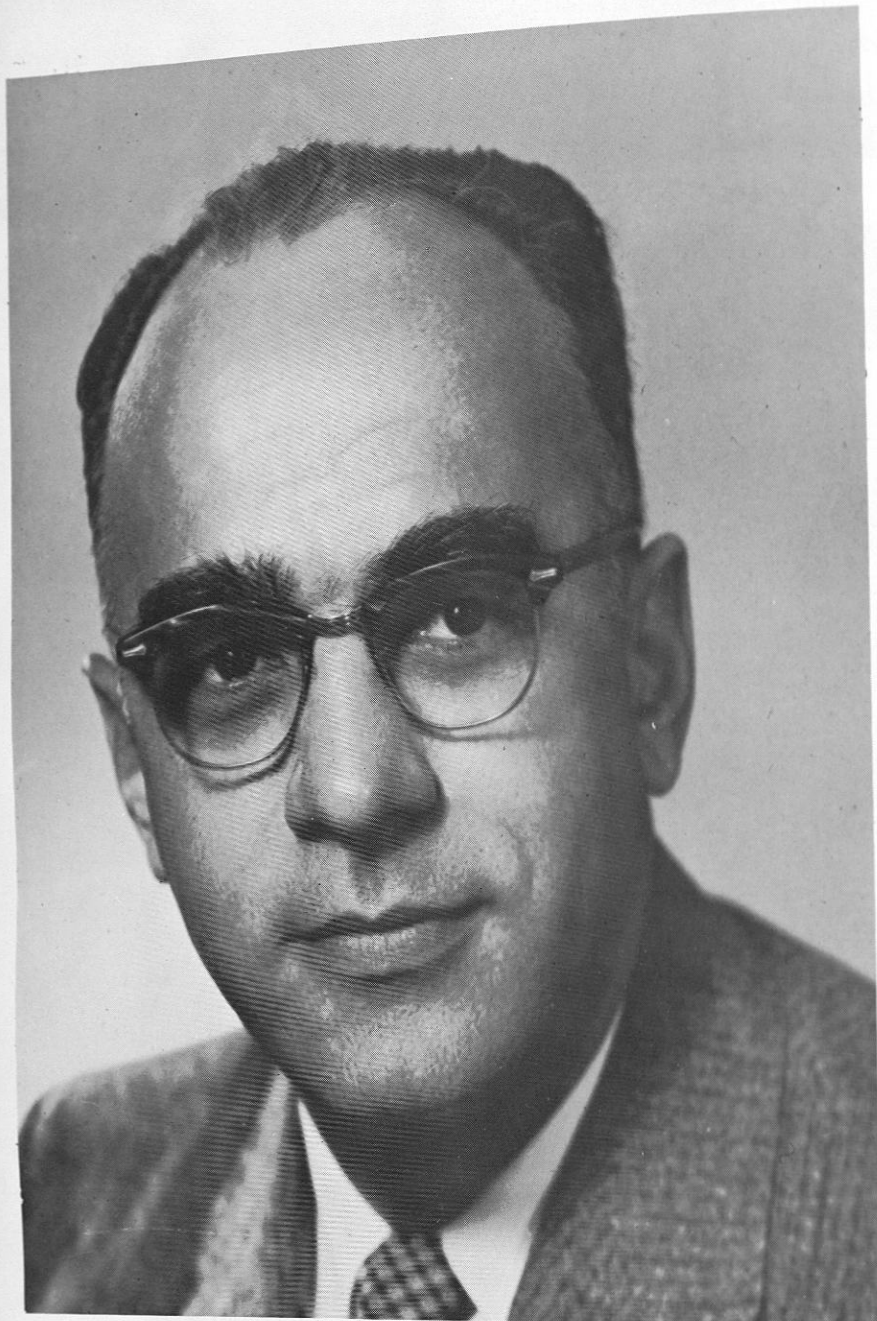

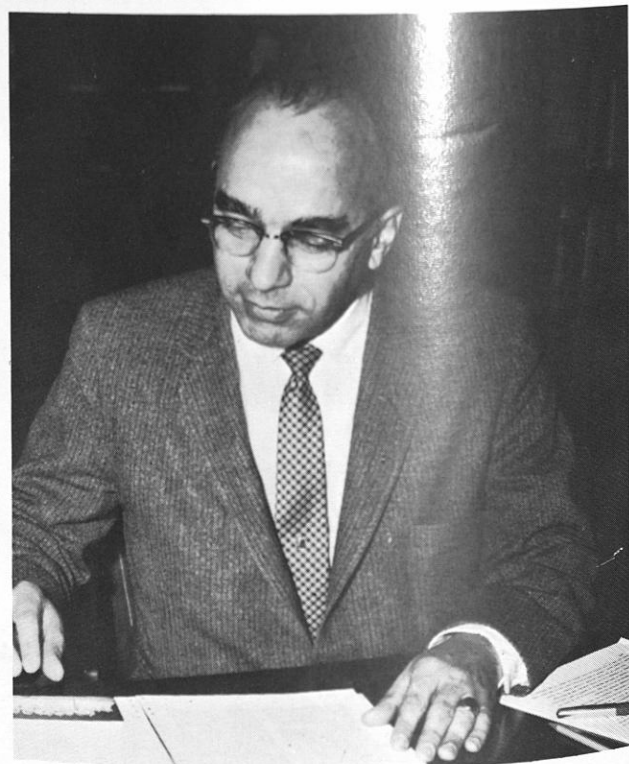

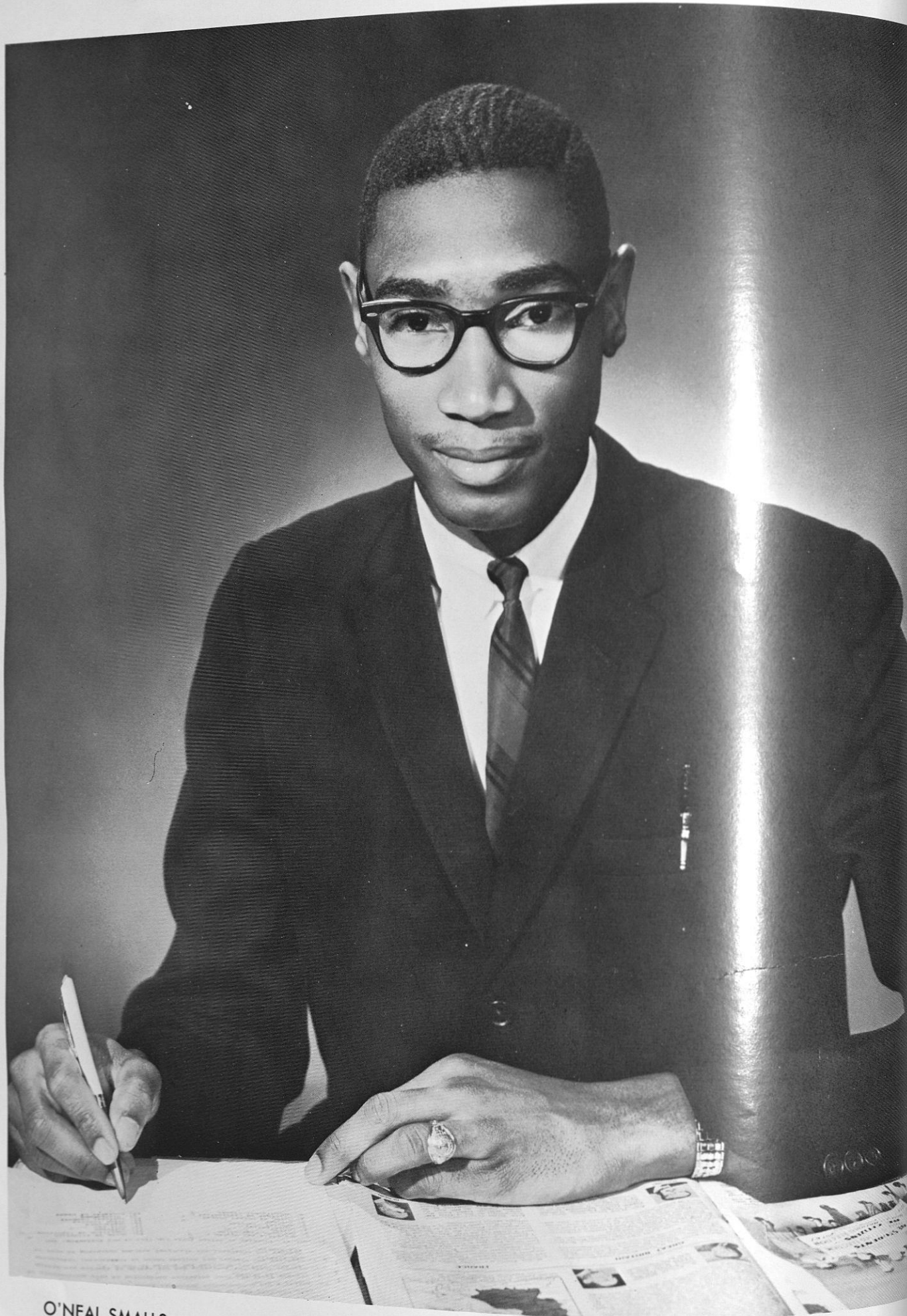

## LETTER FROM THE PRESIDENT OF THE INSTITUTE COUNCIL.....

GREETING FELLOW CLASSMATES,

We the class of '64, came to Tuskegee in 1960 as a part of the "new generation" to whom the "torch" had been passed. Much has happened during our student generation; we find it difficult to understand it all. We saw a man thrust into an orbit located in the unexplored and obscured region of outer space at an unprecedented speed; others followed him. We have yet to understand the implications and the consequences of those trips. Moreover, there was a feeling of fear, uncertainty, and even immediacy as we saw pictures of Soviet missiles and troops in the yard of our back door neighbor and heard the firm, and unmistakable position of our stalwart leader. We saw a man and a new nation emerge. But that was not all; we heard people speak of twenty-five, fifty and one-hundred megaton bombs with destructive capabilities that stagger the imagination. We became concerned with the state of the world. The ban on "above ground nuclear testing" provided a little relief.

On the home-front, many of us participated in freedom rides, marches, sit-ins, kneel-ins, and read-ins in an attempt to bring about a realization of the "American dream." We marched on Washington in an attempt to dramatize our burning desire for "freedom now." Fortunately, we have seen the walls begin to fall.

But we made it. As president of the Institute Council, may I say congratulations. I am sure that as we look back over the years we shall see glimpses of truth that will propel us through the spring years ahead. Ironically, as we leave we have seen the "torch" untimely ripped from the hand of the new generation. We have seen the essence of "pouring the sweet milk of concord into hell," and "sorrows striking heaven on the face." May these remind us of our real task ahead. For it is we who have a "rendezvous with destiny."

# DEPARTMENT OF MILITARY SCIENCE

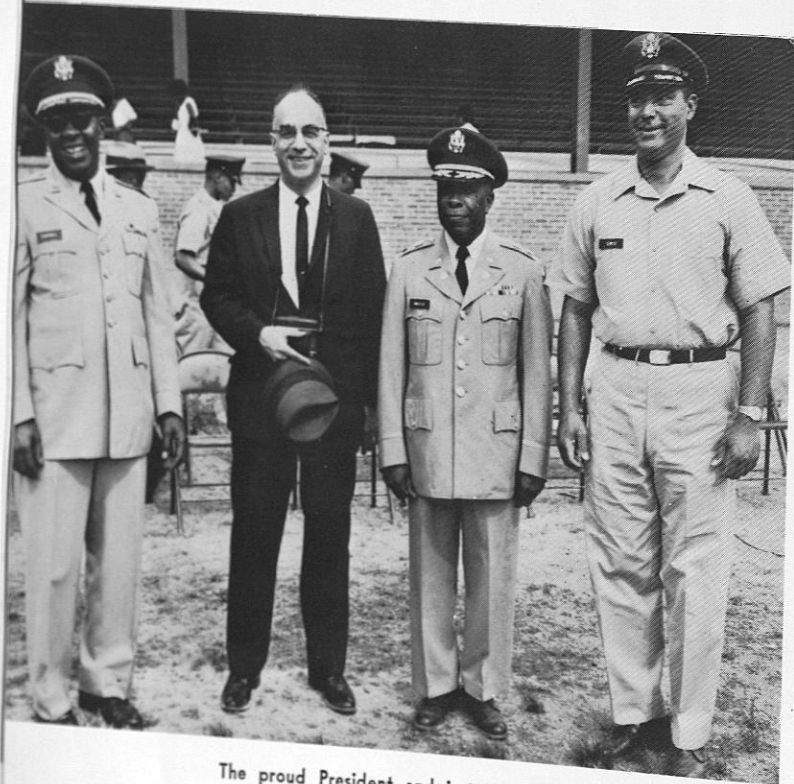

Our life as a student outside the classroom further prepares us for responsible membership in society. Therefore, campus organizations have made it possible for us to take full advantage of this aspect of college life.

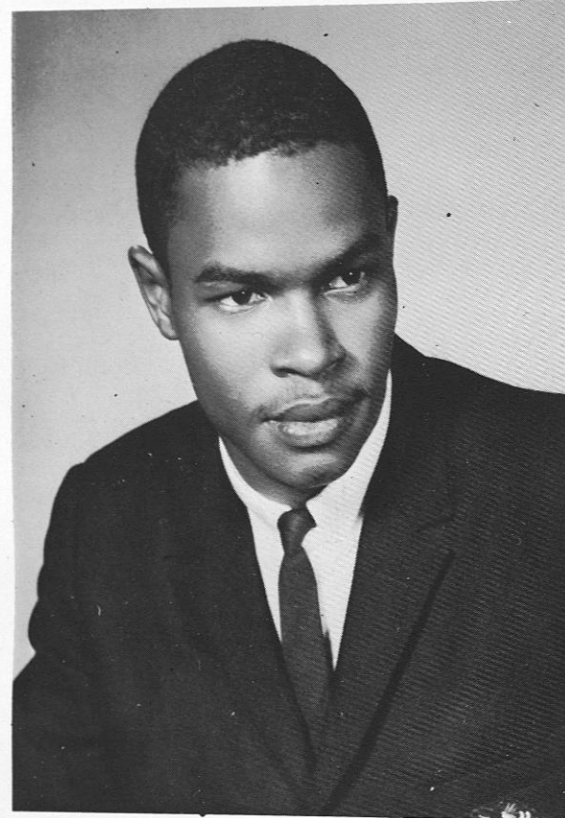

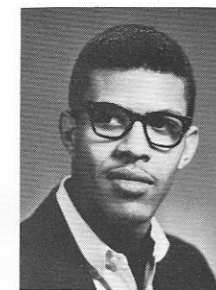
## ELECTROTECTS

# Cagers End Season

Tuskegee Institute, ending its worst season since '61, finished the '64 season with a 8-13 record and were eliminated from the conference tournament, finishing 13th in the standings. The Tigers were dropped from contention when they lost to Fort Valley.

### Wax 'Bama Hornets

Tuskegee had five players in double figures and defeated Alabama State Hornets 112-94 last Saturday night in Logan Hall to end the season. Tuskegee led at halftime 61-35.

Edward Brackins played his last game for Tuskegee and scored 34 points. J. Askew had 22 points for the Hornets.

### Bow To Fort Valley

Fort Valley pulled the unexpected when they upset the Tigers 115-104 here last week. The Wildcats had four players with 22 points or more.

Leonard Robinson of Fort Valley was the high man for Valley, scoring 26 points. Brackins led the Tigers with 29 points.

### Lose To Fisk

Fisk subdued Tuskegee as they rolled to a 111-94 victory over the Tigers. Tuskegee matched baskets early in the game but the scoring power of Tuskegee had over taken the Tigers by halftime.

Renaldo Glover and William Perkins scored 36 and 23 points apiece. Brackins and Frazier led Tuskegee with 21 points.

Tuskegee Institute rolled to a 105-86 win over the Alabama A.&M. Bulldogs before a packed Logan Hall crowd. This was the third meeting of the two teams and the first victory for the Tigers this season over the Bulldogs.

Solomon Frazier scored 34 points for the Golden Tigers and was backed up by Edward Brackins who added 23 points.

Ira Mims and Henry Reid had 20 and 19 points respectively for the A.&M. team.

### Loses To Wolverines

Morris Brown attacked the Tuskegee Tigers and handed them a 78-66 defeat and darkened the conference standings of Tuskegee. The Tigers were winding up a weekend in Atlanta and had defeated Morehouse College earlier.

Tuskegee's scoring was led by lettermen Solomon Frazier and Edward Brackins. Frazier scored 15 points while Brackins hit for 14.

Morris Brown top scorer was Laney Cantrell who scored 18 points.

### Dominates Morehouse

At Morehouse, Tuskegee kicked the hapless team of Morehouse College and defeated them 94-73. The Morehouse team had not won a game all season.

The victory made the only two game sweep that Tuskegee has won over a team this season thus far. Leading scorers for Tuskegee was Solomon Frazier with 20 points and Edward Brackins scoring 19 points.

Ernest Page was high man for Morehouse when he scored 20 points.

### LeMoyne Falls

LeMoyne College fell victims to Tuskegee as the Tigers played a tight scoring game and went past the century mark as they won 101-99. The game saw the lead change several times and this kept the game tense. LeMoyne had defeated the Tigers in Memphis.

Solomon Frazier put on a fine game show as he connected for 34 points. He was backed up by George Lett and Edward Brackins, both scoring 18 points.

Robert Haraway was the high man for LeMoyne scoring 22 points.

### Avenge by Clark Panthers

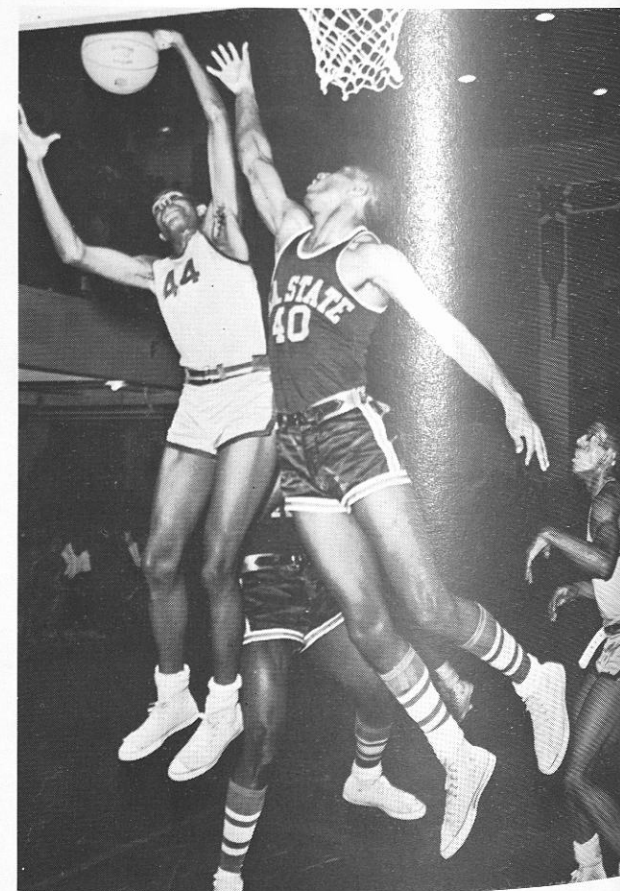

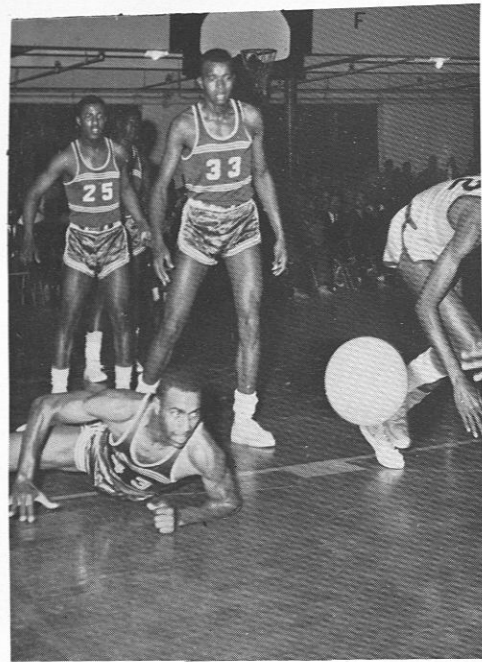

Charlie Smith was the high point man of the game, scoring 30 points.

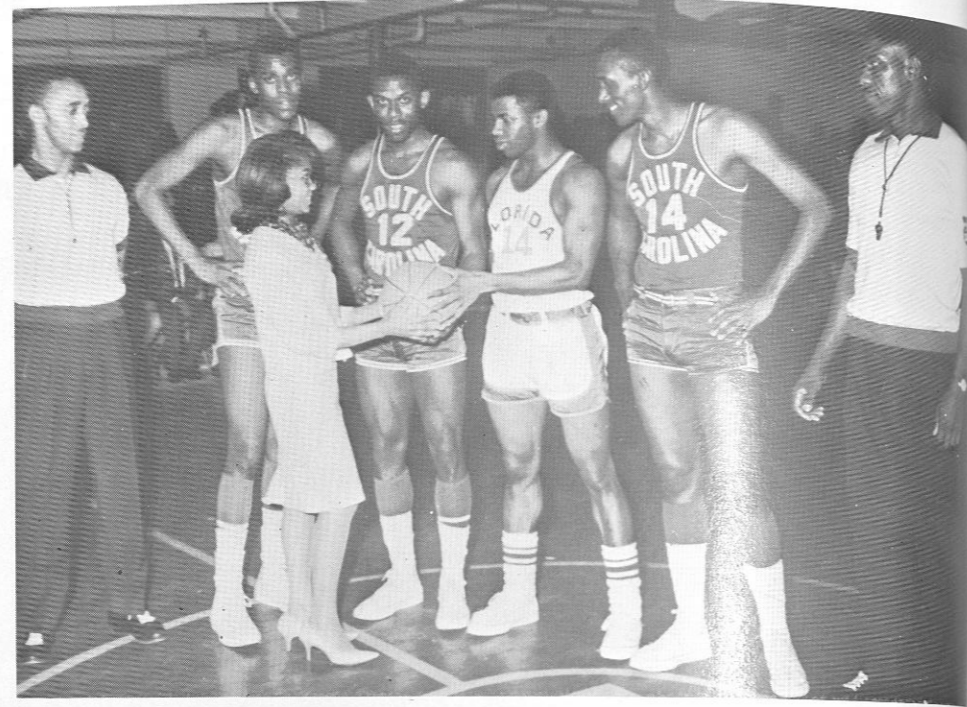

At long last we are upon the threshold of graduation. In just a few short years we have passed through perhaps the most challenging period of our lives.

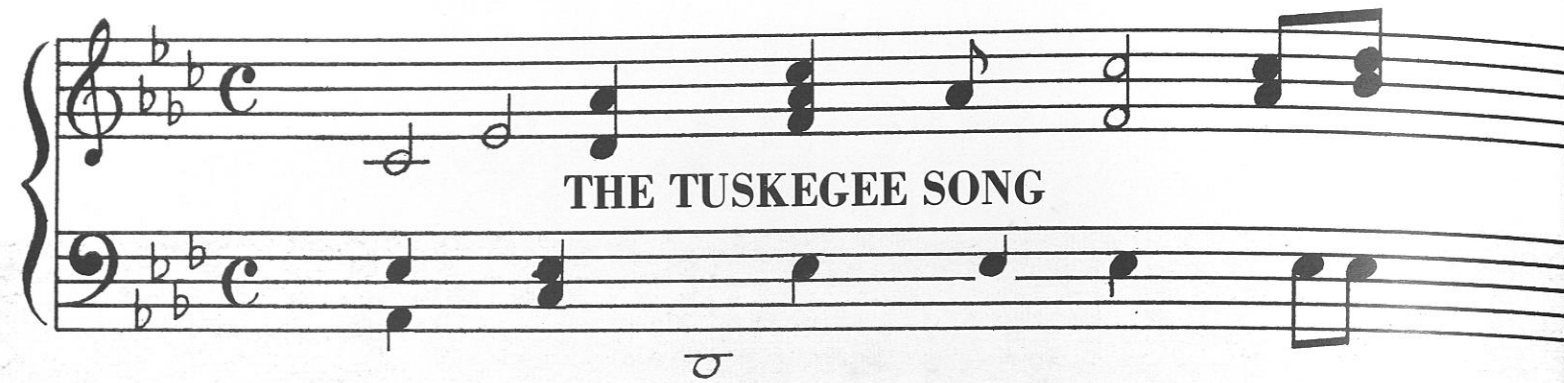

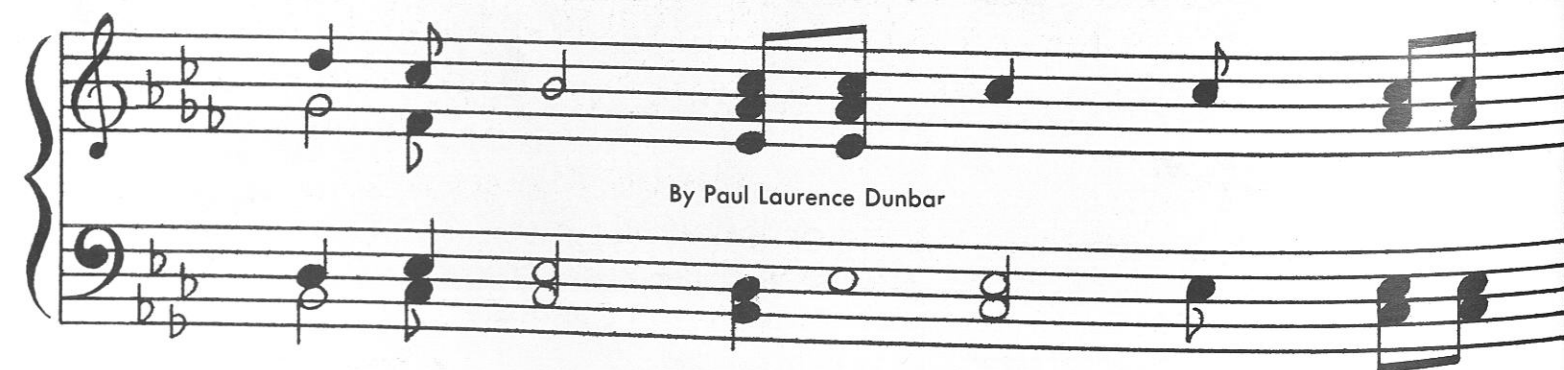

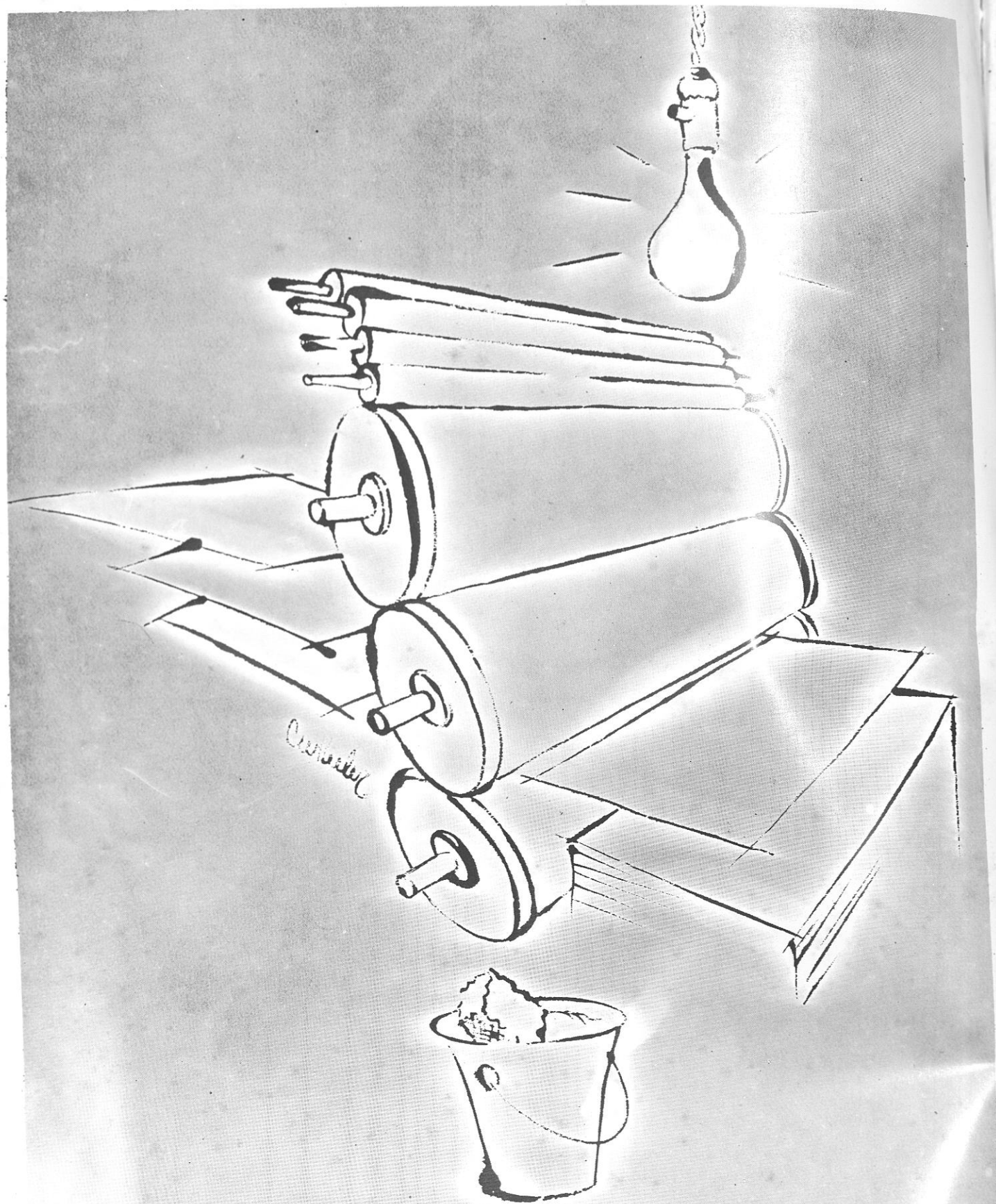
