
## Foreword


## Alma Mater


Tuskegee, thou pride of the swift growing South,

Tuskegee Institute, located one mile west of the city of Tuskegee, Alabama, is a co-educational, privately controlled, professional scientific and technical institution. Since its founding in 1881 by Booker T. Washington, Tuskegee has become one of the most progressive Negro universities of the south.

With an enrollment of nearly 3000 students, Tuskegee has regional accreditation from the Southern Association of Colleges, and regards its first eight decades with considerable pride. Founded under the dynamic and creative leadership of one of the nation's great educators, the school has developed from humble beginnings to render notable service and thereby experience a large measure of public confidence.

Tuskegee is continuously concerned with the total development of its students, utilizing all of its resources to promote the finest and fullest possible growth of each.

## Dedication


Dr. Relford Patterson is a native of Lenoir, North Carolina. He pursued the Bachelor of Music degree in Voice and in Music Education at Howard University. He graduated with honors and was accepted into Pi Kappa Lambda—National Music Honor Society. From Washington University at St. Louis, Missouri, Dr. Patterson earned the Master of Arts degree Composition in 1957 and the Doctor of Philosophy degree in Musicology in 1963.

Dr. Patterson has worked at Shaw University, Raleigh, North Carolina and Wilberforce University, Wilberforce, Ohio.

Presently, Dr. Patterson is Professor of Music and Head of the Department of Music at Tuskegee Institute. He has been Director of the Tuskegee Institute Choir since 1956.

In 1965, Dr. Patterson was named United States Specialist in Music by the Department of State.





## The President

### Dr. Luther H. Foster

Dedicated to his important role as President of Tuskegee Institute, Dr. Luther H. Foster is a man of character, devoted to principle; a college chief executive of ability and prodigious energy. Aside from executing the many duties of his position, the dynamic Dr. Foster is actively concerned with community and world affairs.

Dr. Foster received a Bachelor of Science Degree from Virginia State College in 1932, a Bachelor of Science Degree from Hampton Institute in 1934 and a Master of Business Administration Degree from Harvard University in 1936. Following his acquisition of the Masters Degree, he was employed as Budget Officer of Howard University, Washington, D. C., and served from 1936 to 1940. In 1951 he received his Doctor of Philosophy Degree from the University of Chicago and became Business Manager of Tuskegee Institute. He was promoted to the presidency of Tuskegee in 1953.

During Dr. Foster's administration, Tuskegee Institute has continued to grow, transmitting knowledge for the service of the total community.







## Modern Dance Club




The Modern Dance Club is one featured attraction during half-time at basketball games. The club accepts invitational performances for organizations in various cities and presents an annual program in Logan Hall.



Despite their common ancestry and cultural background, the African and the Negro American are almost completely isolated from one another on college campuses throughout this country. Neither seems sincerely to identify with the other, either because of prejudices, stereotypes, or misinformation.

We at Tuskegee Institute observe this situation with a growing concern, a concern which has led us, a group of Americans and Africans, to form an organization which will work toward eliminating the barriers that have too long separated the Negro American from his non-slave past, and toward creating an atmosphere which will encourage an honest exchange of the ideas, information, and achievements of both cultures. The African Heritage Association invites all members of the Tuskegee Institute community to join us in our efforts to create this most desirable, and most necessary mutual understanding of those of African origin.

## OBJECTIVES

1. To create a forum whereby Africans and Americans (Negroes) would discuss common interests which would create better understandings.
2. To arouse an interest which will create *mutual respect* for each cultural background.
3. To familiarize all of African descent with their African heritage.
4. To share and appreciate the achievements of all of the African origin in all phases of life.


## Tigers Blast Pirates




