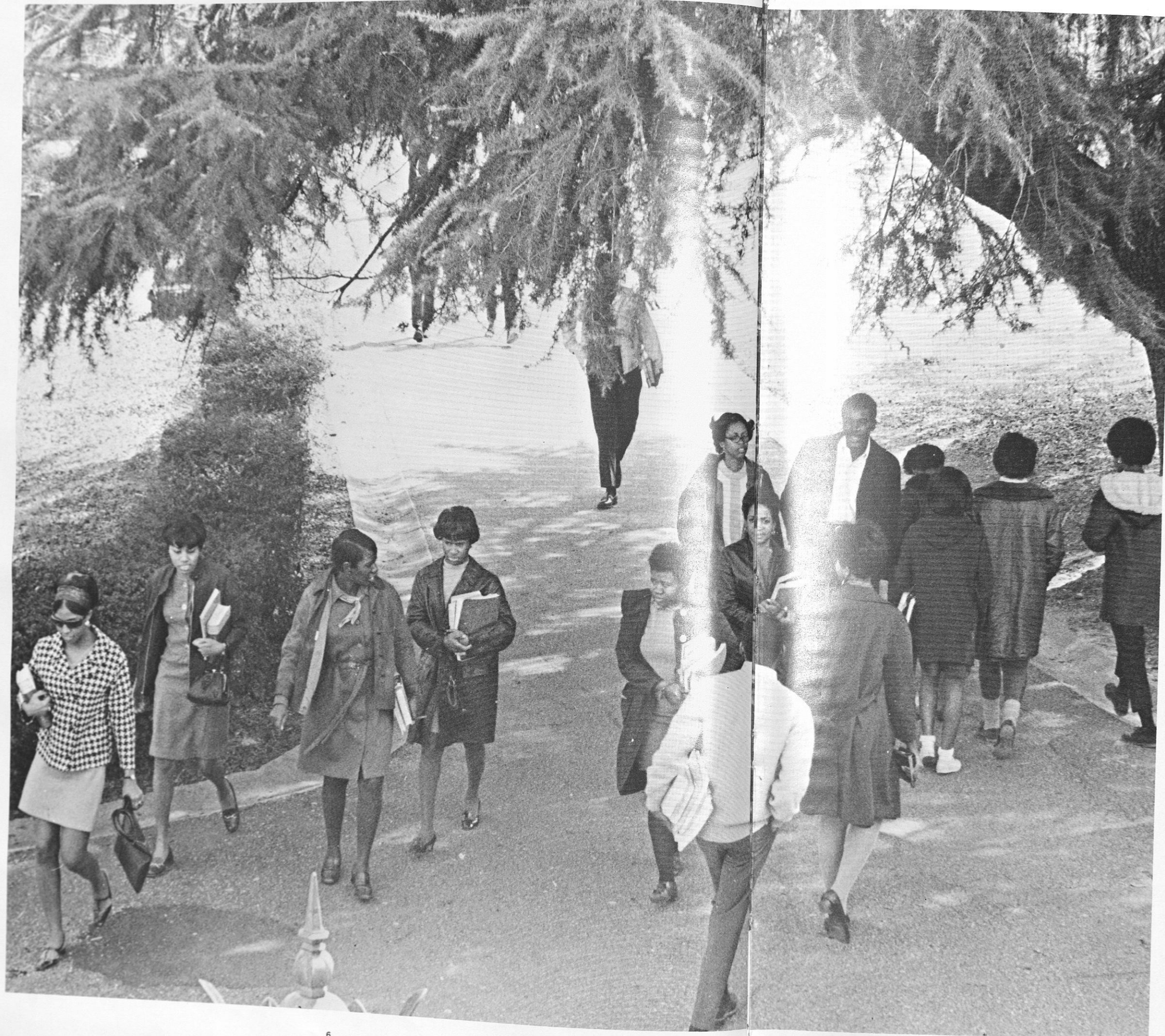

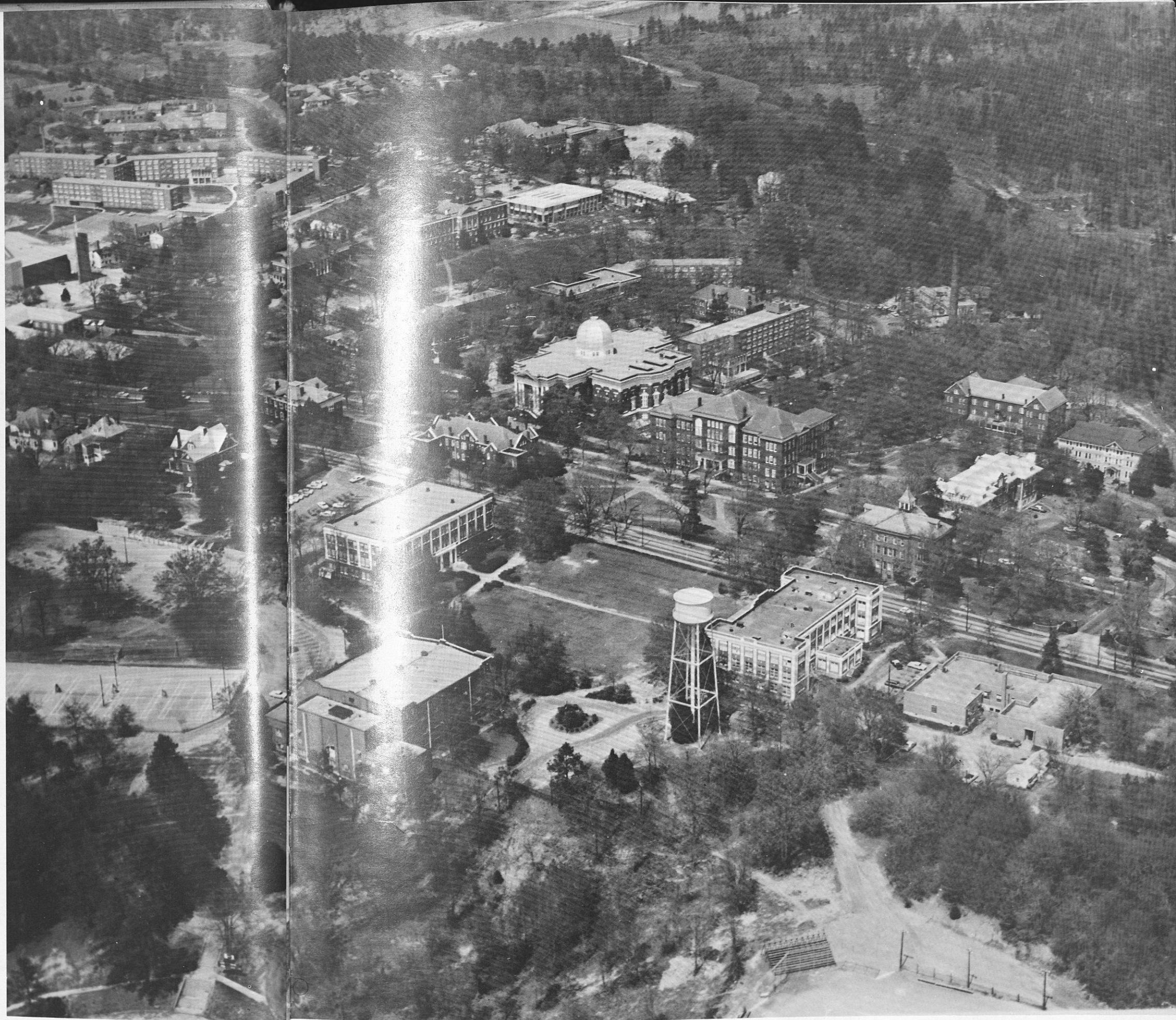


## The Institute

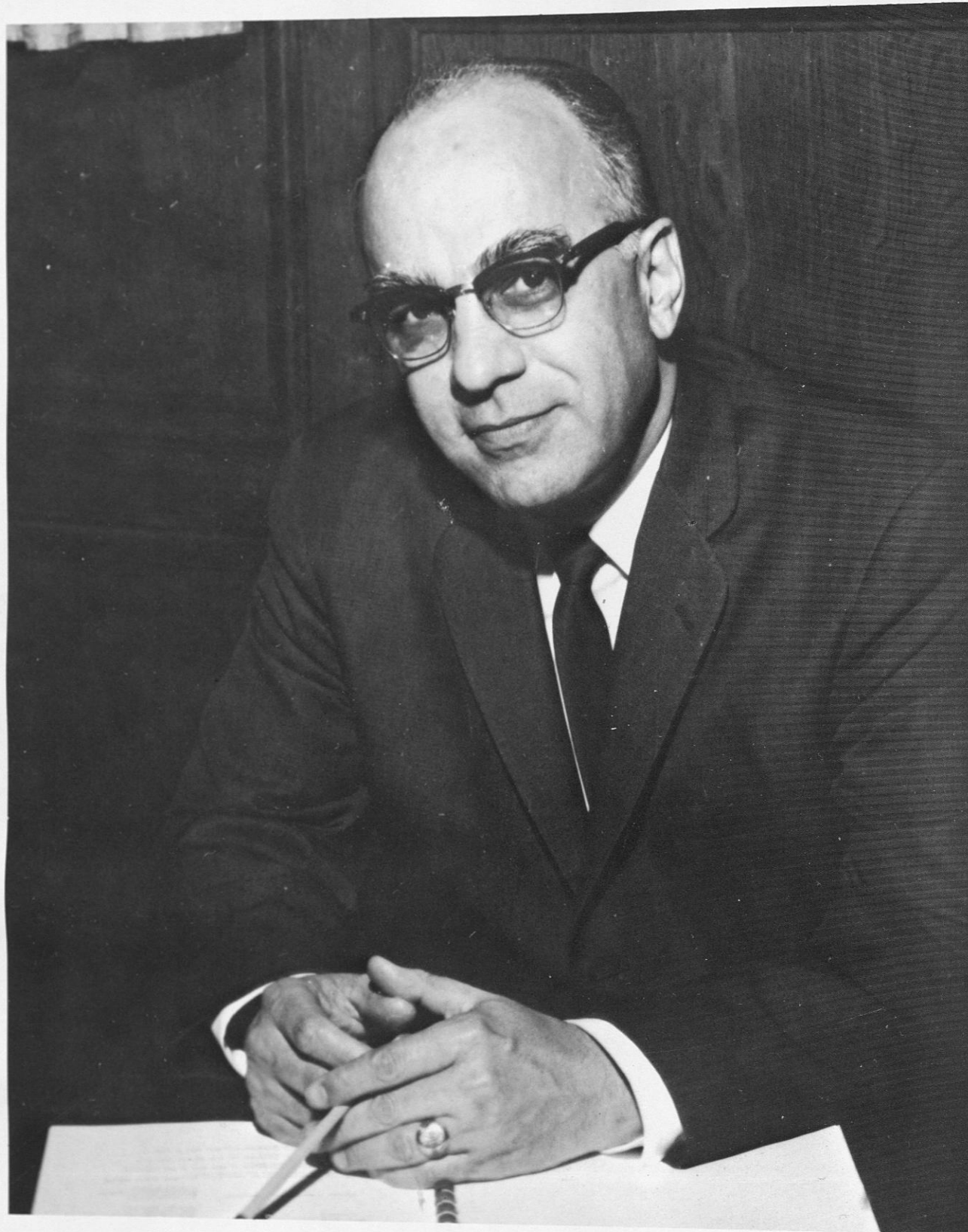
Tuskegee Institute is a co-educational, privately controlled, professional, scientific, and technical institution, with regional accreditation from the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools, and with specialized approval for several of its programs—Nursing, Dietetics, Veterinary Medicine, and Teacher Education—from their respective national associations. Founded by Booker T. Washington in 1881, this independent institution is located in Tuskegee, Alabama, one mile west of the town of Tuskegee.

Thirty-two (32) degree-granting courses of study constitute the curricula for seven major areas of instruction—College of Arts and Sciences, Schools of Applied Sciences, Education, Engineering, Veterinary Medicine, and Department of Physical Education. Graduate programs are offered in the College of Arts and Sciences and in the Schools of Education, Engineering and Applied Sciences.

Special features in Tuskegee's program include: The George Washington Carver Museum; The George Washington Carver Research Foundation; the John A. Andrew Hospital; the Department of Social Sciences Research; and the Reserve Officers Training Corps for the Army and Air Force.







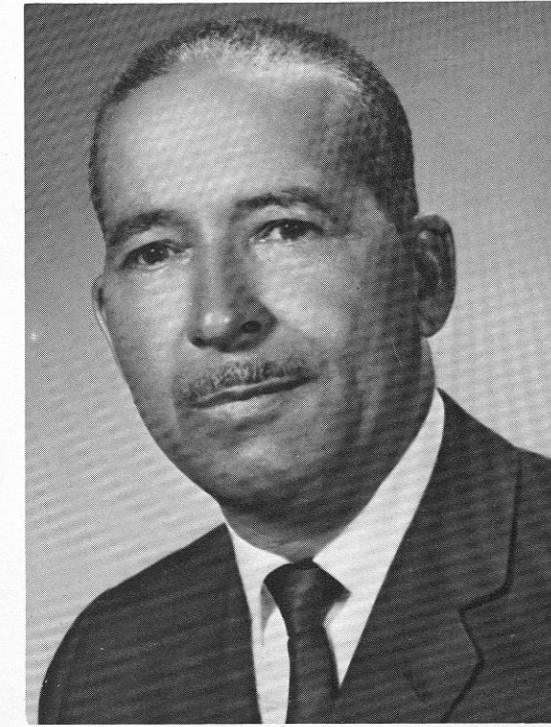

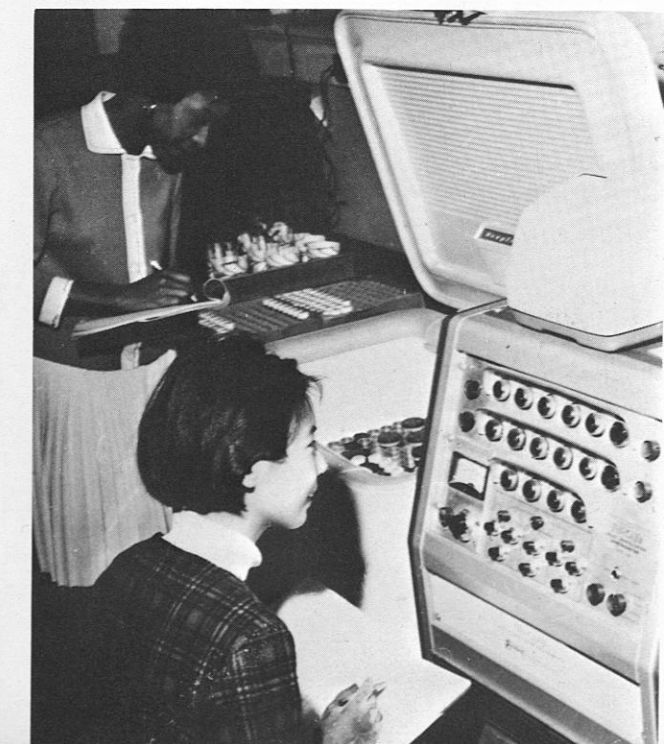

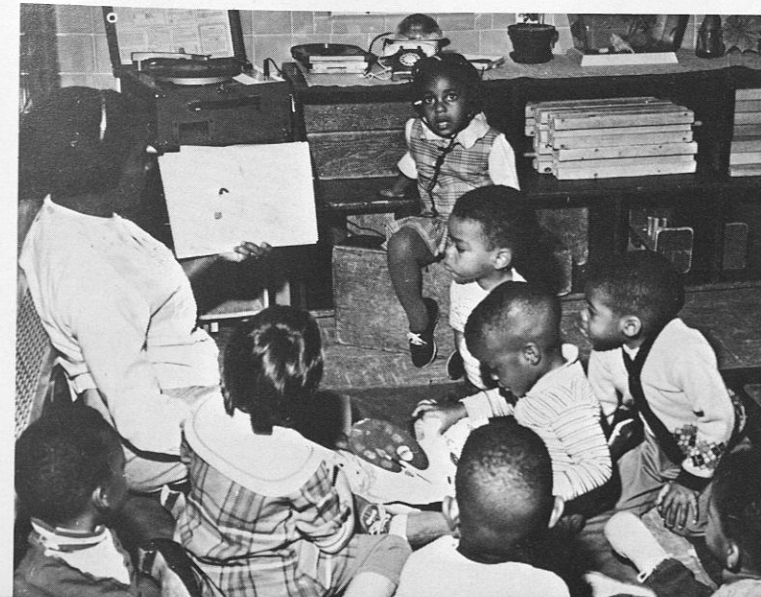

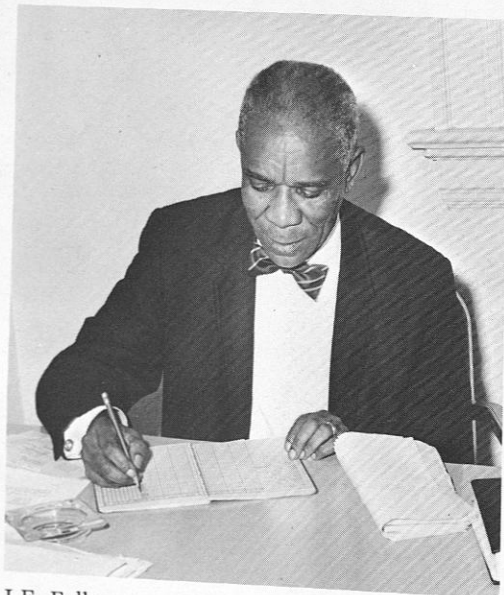
# Department of Mathematics

The Department of Mathematics offers a curriculum leading to the B.S. degree in mathematics. 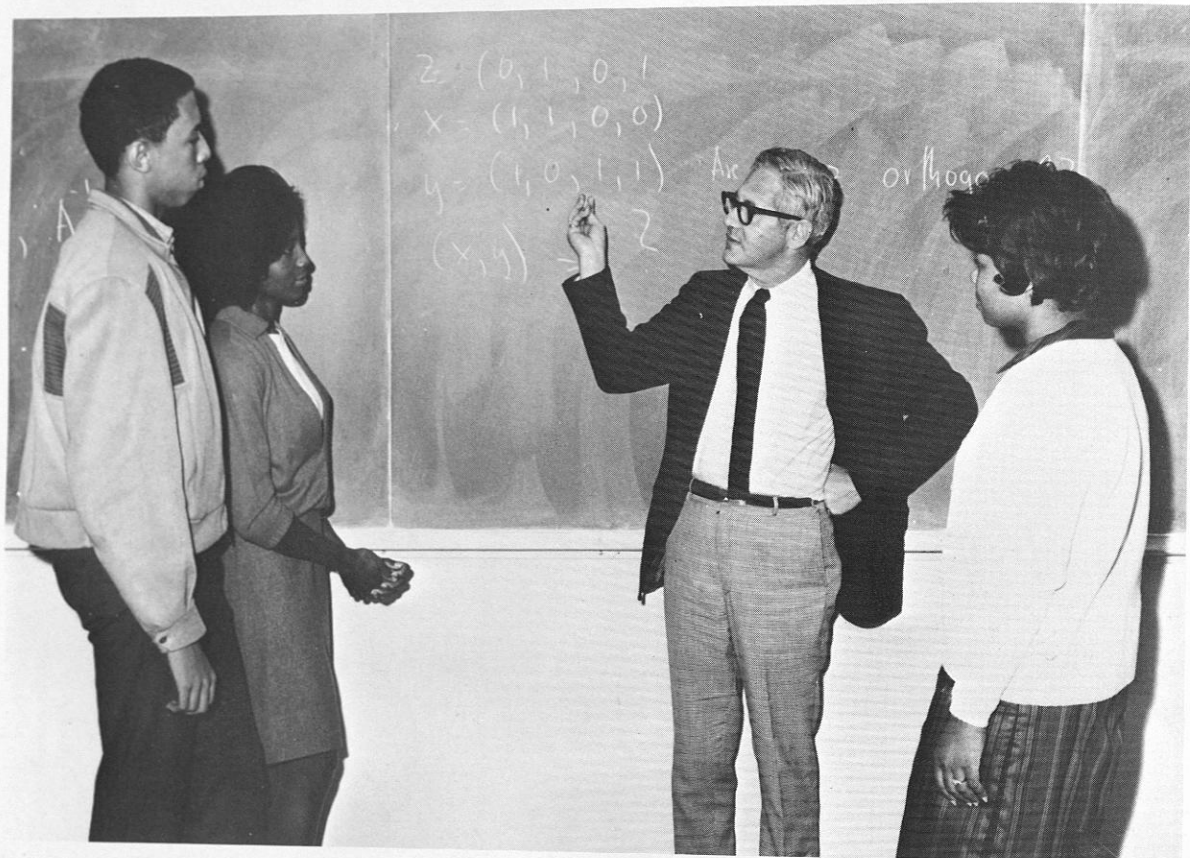

Biology can and should be one of the most stimulating subjects in a college curriculum. Nothing else, after all, has such personal relevance as the phenomenon of life. Biology as the study of life, sheds light on what every individual experiences in himself and observes around him. Modern biology, unlike the classical approach of description and cataloguing, has some exciting new approaches to the study of "life's" problems. For example, studies at the molecular level using super-speed centrifuges to spin down sub-cellular and molecular components (top left). The electron microscope is used to study "life" at the ultrastructural level (middle left).

The cell and tissues are the next level of study and an important instrument is the light microscope (middle right). Studies on the functions of various organs, especially in humans, are important in modern biology. Such studies can be performed on instruments like the physiograph (bottom left...being used here to record pulse rate). Studies at the whole animal or plant level involve among other things the use of drugs and isolated hormones to answer questions about growth and development (bottom right...note the dwarf and tall corn plants in this growth experiment).

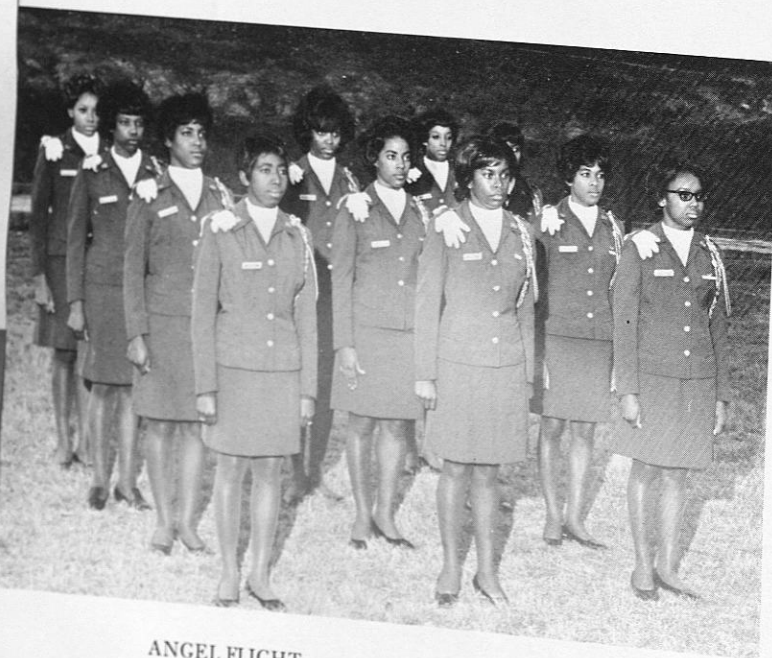
AIR FORCE ROTC FLIGHT INSTRUCTION PROGRAM

The Cessna 172 is used in the flight training program of Air Force ROTC Detachment 15, Tuskegee Institute. The Flight Instruction Program consists of thirty hours of theory conducted by Major Donald D. Marsh, and thirty-six hours of flight instruction conducted by Mr. C. Alfred Anderson. The program is designed to initially qualify those cadets who will enter pilot training upon entry into the United States Air Force. Upon completion of the Flight Instruction Program, the cadets are qualified to take the Federal Aviation Administration's Private Pilot's written examination and flight check.



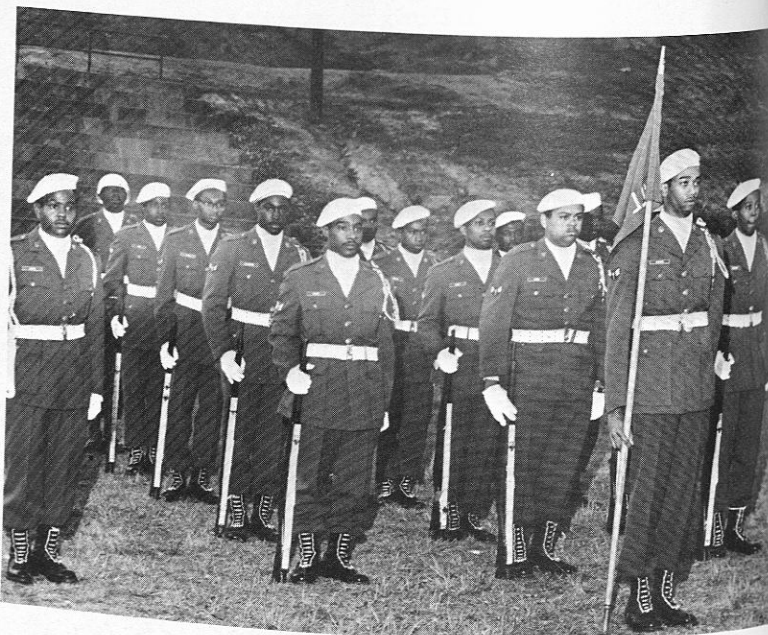
