#### PREFACE

#### FORTY-NINTH ANNUAL FARMERS' CONFERENCE

Today agriculture is going through a period of rapid adjustments. New changes bring with them new problems The one-crop system is losing ground, our foreign markets have dwindled, mechanization of agriculture and livestock farming are making severe inroads on farm laborers. Fewer farmers are needed, and many rural people are poorly fed, ill-clad and inadequately housed.

A solution in part of the above conditions is the encouragement of rural people to make greater use of their home farm resources. Manures and organic material can be utilized as a source of plant food. Lowlands can be cleared and drained for pastures, provisions should be made for the home food supply, ample gardens, fruit trees, livestock for meat and milk. Home improvements can be made with material produced on or near the home farm.

To meet the needs of our farmers the Forty-Ninth Annual Farmers' Conference has dedicated itself to the purpose of "Helping the Farmer Help Himself."
