U. N. SEMINAR - 1962

Sunday, October 28 to Tuesday, October 30

NOTE THE CHANGED DATE! AFTER instead of BEFORE the National Board Meeting on October 26 - 28 in Philadelphia. Yet Board members can still attend both events. Registration will be at the YWCA on the West Side at the Laura Spelman Residence, 840 Eighth Avenue, on Sunday.

REASON for CHANGE

UN Day is being celebrated so widely this year that we could secure speakers from neither the UN Secretariat nor from the U.S. Mission for the 22nd, 23rd or 24th; we could not be assured a room for briefing because the demand for space has been increased by the presence of 104 Delegations instead of the 70 of previous years. Besides, protests came from some of our members who have speaking dates on the UN at schools or churches in their communities. We hope that the change will not alter your plans for attending and suggest that if you have not already made plans for the observance by the Branch, there is still time and "every reason" to do so.

HIGH HOPES FOR PROGRAM

The program will be centered around the priorities of the WILPF in their relationship to the issues facing the UN in 1963. We shall be brought up to date on disarmament, but the emphasis will be on the Decade of Development and the United Nations and Colonialism. Expert speakers, such as Ambassador Phillip Klotznick, U.S. Representative to the Economic and Social Council and Michael Scott, will, we hope, address us and offer opportunity for questions. The earlier date precluded such good luck.

HEADQUARTERS

We have reserved 12 double rooms at the YWCA, Eighth Avenue and 51st Street\* (Ci-6-3700) but you must make your own reservation. Rooms are \$3.50 per person for two in a double room with bath.
